

"Is there any chance of something like this again?" asked Brigid Bludau after a family visit to Cub Run Stream Valley's Snowflake Trail last winter.

Yes! The free, nature-themed scavenger hunt will make a return this year from Thanksgiving through the holiday season.

The trails behind Cub Run Rec Center are one of the many lesser-known gems in the Park Authority's 420 parks. Last winter, Cub Run Naturalist and Historian Chris Terpak-Malm (aka Grandmother Frost) marked a roughly one-mile trail at the park with snowflake symbols and QR codes containing video clues. Folks who scanned the QR codes discovered that Grandmother Frost had lost her holiday gifts for the woodland animals at Cub Run and needed help to find them. Participants could follow clues to the gifts while learning about the animals who inhabit the woods.



"I wanted kids to have fun outside. I wanted them to learn a little bit, run through the woods, and giggle at some silly elements," said Terpak-Malm. The goal was to create a family-friendly way to get everyone outdoors during the COVID-19 shutdowns, and visitors of all ages were swept up in the fun.

"WE LOVED IT!!," Bludau wrote. "I have four children and we spent three hours on the trails and playground." Malm said she especially enjoyed hearing from parents who said that as soon as their kids completed the trail, they wanted to start all over again.
