### **South Run Rec** Center\*

**7550 Reservation Drive** Springfield

South Run Rec Center opened in June 1988. In 2017, the playground and tot lot were upgraded, in addition to the Go Ape ropes course opening. South Run Rec Center features sports fields and courts, wooded trails, a dog park and an indoor field house. There is a trail that connects Burke Lake Park to the Rec Center.



### **Spring Hill Rec Center\***

1239 Spring Hill Road McLean

Spring Hill Rec Center features an indoor walking track and sports programming in the gymnasium in addition to spacious pool, Fitness Center and multipurpose rooms hosting classes and camps. In 2024, this Rec Center got a sustainable upgrade with rooftop solar panels, a geothermal HVAC system and energy-efficient pool dehumidification units.



### **Sully Historic** Site

3650 Historic Sully Way Chantilly

On September 1, 1959, President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed a bill transferring the Federal Aviation Administration's property at Sully to the Park Authority for use as a historic site. Sully Historic Site showcases the area's transportation history and evolving land use. The site features the remains of a bridge over Cain's Branch, which was abandoned in the early 1900s to build a road leading to a growing neighboring town.



### Woodlands **Stewardship Education Center**

5301 Walney Road Chantilly

The Woodlands Stewardship Education Center is one of the newest and most innovative facilities in the FCPA System. The building opened in 2024 and is designed to meet the rigorous sustainability standards of the Living Building Challenge. Only a small handful of buildings have achieved this standard of development, including structure, design, systems, materials, and operation.

### **Burke Lake** Park

7315 Ox Road **Fairfax Station** 

The first carousel in the Fairfax County Park Authority (FCPA) was installed on April 9, 1953. FCPA has five carousels across multiple parks throughout the county.



### Clemyjontri **Park**

6317 Georgetown Pike McLean

Clemyjontri Park opened in 2006 and was the first all-inclusive playground in Virginia. Adele Lebowitz donated the 18-acre tract of land for the playground and park. Clemyjontri Park got its name in honor of Ms. Lebowitz's four children- Carolyn (CI), Emily (Emy), John (Jon), and Petrina (Tri). In 2010 the first Liberty Swing was installed, a wheel-chair accessible swing and one of only 15 in the U.S.



### **Frying Pan Farm Park Meeting** House\*

2615 Centreville Road Herndon

The Meeting House at Frying Pan Farm Park is one of the oldest surviving Baptist churches in Virginia, dating to 1791. From the very beginning, the church welcomed all and had a raciallyintegrated congregation. A common question asked about Frying Pan Farm Park is how it got its name. Frying Pan Farm Park is named after the nearby stream that has been known as the Frying Pan Branch since the 1700s.



### **Hidden Oaks Nature Center**

7701 Rovce Street **Annandale** 


was the first nature center the Park Authority opened in 1969. The nature center was built in Annandale because of its central location in Fairfax County, and the original headquarters for the Park Authority (the Packard Center) was next door at the time. **Today, Hidden Oaks Nature Center** is surrounded by trails with live animal displays and an interactive urban woodlands exhibit.



### **Lake Fairfax** Park\*

1400 Lake Fairfax Drive Reston

The history of Lake Fairfax Park dates back to the early 1700s, At one point a commercial airstrip was zoned where the athletic fields are today. The Park Authority purchased the land in 1966. The newest feature at Lake Fairfax Park is the Inline Stake Rink that was built in partnership with the Washington Capitals.



### **Oakmont Golf** Center

3136 Jermantown Road **Oakton** 

Oakmont Golf Center, opened in 1998, and has earned the reputation of being one of the best teaching facilities in Northern Virginia. The golf course features 9-holes, and the 78 station driving range was fully renovated in 2018.



### **Patriot Park** North

**5425 Willow Springs** School Road, Fairfax Baseball and softball teams come play on the park's six synthetic turf diamond fields. The park also features batting cages, warmup areas, lighting, a 360-degree press box and deck, live streaming capability, concession stands, trails and playground.



### **Riverbend Park** 8700 Potomac Hills Street **Great Falls**

Riverbend Park, along the Potomac River, has a rich history dating back 17,000 years. The park has over one hundred archeological sites. By analyzing stone tools found at Riverbend Park, archaeologists have determined the first people lived there during the Paleoindian period, from 15000-8000 BCE. In fact, three Virginia Indian tribes have lived at Riverbend Park throughout its history.
