#### **ACTION**

<u>Turner Farm Park Observatory – Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program</u> Request – Analemma Society (Dranesville District)

### ISSUE:

Approval of a Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program request from the Analemma Society in the amount of \$5,135.00 to help fund a project to retrofit the pathway bollard lights at Turner Farm Park Observatory.

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Park Authority Director recommends approval of the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program request from the Analemma Society in the amount of \$5,135.00 to help fund a project to retrofit the pathway bollard lights at Turner Farm Park Observatory.

### TIMING:

Board action is requested on May 24, 2023 in order to award the grant.

### **BACKGROUND:**

The Analemma Society, through an agreement with the Park Authority, has been conducting astronomy and science educational programs for more than a decade at Turner Farm Park Observatory. This project aims to reduce light pollution and thus provide more authentic views of the night sky for participants in astronomy programs held at the observatory. The project will also move Turner Farm Park Observatory closer to the Park Authority's goal of achieving *Urban Night Sky Place* (UNSP) designation by the International Dark Sky Association (IDA).

The project entails removal of 26 bollard heads which contain LED light fixtures, then sending the bollard heads to the vendor of origin, where they will be retrofitted with LED lights that meet certain specifications related to kelvins, warmth, and color. Staff within the Park Operations Division will manage the project and provide labor for removal of the bollard heads, preparing them to be shipped, and reinstalling the bollard heads upon their return.

The Analemma Society is requesting \$5,135.00 from the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Program (Attachment 2). If approved, the \$5,135.00 from the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant program, along with a donation of

\$5,135.00 from the Analemma Society, comprise sufficient funding to complete the project. The total project budget is \$10,270.00.

The Park Authority Board Member for the Dranesville District supports approval of the Grant request. Staff from the Park Operations Division will manage the project, which is scheduled to be completed in FY2024. Matching funds are available to complete this project.

### FISCAL IMPACT:

The estimated total project cost is \$10,270.00. Funds are currently available in the amount of \$5,135.00 in WBS PR-000147, 2020 Park Bond - Park Renovations and Upgrades, in Fund 30400, Park Bond Construction Fund; and \$5,135 from the Analemma Society, resulting in total available funding of \$10,270.00. Operational and maintenance expenses will be managed using existing operating resources.

Contingent on the approval of this project, the remaining balance in the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program will be \$763,525.00.

This is a project to retrofit existing walkway bollard lights to be compliant by changing LED lights. **Observatory Park at Turner Farm** is at the end stages of its 2 ½ year application to the **International Dark Sky Association** (IDA) for award of an **Urban Night Sky Place** (UNSP) designation. It will be only the 7th one to date. The last piece that needs to be addressed as required by IDA award criteria is to retrofit the existing bollards (walkway lights) to meet IDA dark-sky-friendly lighting requirements.

The top of the bollards must be sent to Victoria BC for retrofit by the manufacturer in order to meet IDA requirements. The kelvins and lumens must meet stringent requirements for IDA designation award as well as being fully shielded and pointing toward the ground. This is a huge accomplishment for Fairfax County as it is already home to the largest on-campus observatory in the mid-Atlantic region located at GMU's Fairfax Campus. In addition, Virginia is home to the largest number of Dark Sky Parks (DSP's) of any state east of the Mississippi. Earning this designation ASAP will keep Fairfax County and Virginia ahead of the pack and allow it to be the model for dark-sky-friendly responsible outdoor light at night.

### 4. Public Benefits

Light pollution is a major environmental problem. This project aims to reduce light pollution by creating demonstration lights showing proper dark sky lighting design to help educate the public on this. In doing so it also improves the lighting at the observatory to provide better views of the night sky for participants in our astronomy outreach programs.

In order to meet the requirements for award of designation of an UNSP by IDA, these light fixtures must be modified to make them compliant with the requirements of the program. UNSPs seek to give users an authentic night experience in areas with substantial amounts of existing light pollution. Awarding this designation will allow many people who have never seen night sky objects, given proximity to Washington DC and the surrounding urban areas, to come to an area where they can see the stars, to view the night skies with telescopes, and to be part of educational programs designed to educate people about the about the deadly effects of artificial light.



### RECOMMENDATION:

The Park Authority Director recommends approval of the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program request from Baroody Camps, Inc. in the amount of \$2,382.00 to help fund a project to install windscreens at the athletic courts at Lewinsville Park.

### TIMING:

Board action is requested on May 24, 2023 in order to award the grant.

### BACKGROUND:

The increasing popularity of pickleball has been driving high demand for the athletic courts at Lewinsville Park (Attachment 1). Wind often interferes with play such that it affects player performance and even safety. Baroody Camps, an organization that provides pickleball instruction at FCPA facilities, has proposed windscreens to address this problem.

The proposed project, which meets FCPA specifications, entails installing 230 linear feet of 9-foot-high black privacy slats on the existing pickleball court fencing along the 120-foot sideline and along 110-feet of endline.

Baroody Camps is requesting \$2,382.00 from the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Program (Attachment 2). If approved, the \$2,382.00 from the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant program, along with a donation of \$2,382.00 from Baroody Camps, comprise sufficient funding to complete the project. The total project budget is \$4,764.00.

Pickleball is played year round on the Lewinsville courts and the location is often exposed to stong consistent winds that impact the path of the ball and negatively affect play. FCPA has approved the site for installation of PVC Slat windscreens to be installed by Long Fence under an existing services agreement wth FCPA. An aerial photograph and a pricing quote provided by Long Fence accompanies this proposal.

Pickleball is the fastest growing sport in the US; hundreds of players currently utilize the Lewinsville Park courts year round. The number of players using this facility is expected to grow rapidly. Wind has proven to be an ongoing challenge in every season that affects player performance and safety. Many players have repeatedly requested that windscreens be installed to address this problem. Wind impacts all players at every skill level, undermining players' ability to place and return the ball and in some cases forcing players to rapidly shift running direction to reach the ball in play, creating a safety hazard. The proposed design is fully code-compliant.

Baroody works with Fairfax Parks to implement child and adult programming for recreation centers and looks forward to helping community members enjoy the benefits of recreation for the long term in cooperation with the county. The project will be completed in accordance with county requirements under an existing agreement and implementation will be recorded with photos and text documenting the work to completion. Long Fence has described the PVC Slats windscreen as virtually maintenance-free; Baroody Camps will contract under the Park Authority MOU to be responsible for any required maintenance.
