<u>Lake Fairfax Park</u> – <u>Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program Request – Cricket Association of Fairfax County (Hunter Mill District)</u>

ISSUE:

Approval of a Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant request from the Cricket Association of Fairfax County in the amount of \$15,325 to help fund a project to replace the artificial cricket pitch at Lake Fairfax Park.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Park Authority Executive Director recommends approval of a Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant award to the Cricket Association of Fairfax County in the amount of \$15,325 to help fund a project to replace the artificial cricket pitch at Lake Fairfax Park.

TIMING:

Board action is requested on December 13, 2023, in order to award the grant.

BACKGROUND:

In 1997 field 8 at Lake Fairfax Park was developed into the first cricket field in Fairfax County (Attachment 1). This effort was championed by various cricket clubs who joined forces in 1998 to become the Cricket Association of Fairfax County (CAFC). CAFC agreed to maintain the cricket pitch at Lake Fairfax Park, which they have done so ever since. Recently CAFC and FCPA signed a Park Improvement MOU to formalize this arrangement.

Growth in the sport of cricket and the introduction of major league cricket in the USA have given rise to a demand for cricket facilities that meet international standards. Lake Fairfax field 8 is one of the few fields in the NOVA region large enough to meet these standards. Today it is one of the most heavily used cricket fields in the county, hosting youth, adult and national tournaments throughout the Spring, Summer and Fall.

As with the field, the condition of the wicket, or surface of the pitch, is of utmost importance to playability and safety. The existing pitch suffers from poor drainage and is beyond repair. CAFC therefore desires to replace the pitch with a new pitch consisting of a concrete base and artificial turf. Over the past year CAFC has worked closely with staff to compile specifications for the pitch, scope the proposed project, and obtain cost estimates. CAFC is requesting \$15,325 from the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Funds Grant Program to help fund the completion of the project (Attachment 2).

The total project budget is \$30,650. If approved, the \$15,325 Mastenbrook grant, along with a contribution of \$15,325 from CAFC, will provide the needed funding to complete the project. Sufficient funds are available in the Mastenbrook Matching Fund Grant program to award the grant. Maintenance costs will be managed as outlined in the Park Improvement MOU. Specifically, CAFC will be responsible for the maintenance, repair and future replacement of the cricket pitch carpet.

The Park Authority Board Member for the Hunter Mill District supports approval of the grant request. The project will be managed by the Park Operations Division and is expected to be completed by Spring 2024.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The estimated total project cost is \$30,650. Funds are currently available in the amount of \$15,325 in WBS PR-000147, Park Renovations and Upgrades-2020, Fund 300-C30400, Park Bond Construction Fund; and \$15,325 from CAFC, resulting in total available funding of \$30,650.

Contingent on approval of this grant, the remaining balance in the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program will be \$657,060.



Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grants Program Proposal

Purpose

The Cricket Association of Fairfax County (CAFC) is pleased to apply for the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant to replace the cricket pitch at Lake Fairfax Park's field number 8 and is requesting funding in the amount of \$20,000.

Brief History of Cricket in Fairfax County

In 1996 with World Cup of Cricket being extensively televised in the United States, the Fairfax Cricket Club was formed to promote the sport of cricket in the County.

In 1997, through the efforts of the club and in close collaboration with Fairfax County Park Authority (FCPA) and the then Community Recreation Services (now NCS) field 8 at Lake Fairfax Park was developed into the first cricket field in the county and Northern Virginia.

In 1998 the newly formed Cosmos Cricket Club and Virginia Cricket Club joined Fairfax to form the CAFC and agreed to jointly maintain the cricket field.

Since then, cricket has burgeoned to be one of the fastest growing sports in the county and nation with numerous leagues and clubs being formed. Prince William County and Loudon County now exceed Fairfax County in the number of fields and lighted fields available.

The first youth program was started in the Northern Virginia region 12 years ago by CAFC and we are proud that several of our youth players have been selected to represent the national team at both youth and senior levels. The club also produced the first female youth player to represent the region.

We have hosted many international touring teams from Australia, Caribbean, New Zealand, and the UK with the British Royal Marines playing here in 2019.

Cricket Pitch and Field Requirements

Cricket unlike baseball relies on a hard and even surface (wicket) to pitch (bowl) the ball. As the ball normally bounces before a batsmen can play it, the condition of the wicket is of utmost importance to the integrity of the game and safety of

players. The wicket is usually 70 feet by 10 feet with the actual dimension of the playing area 66 feet by 8 feet 8 inches. Typically, a natural turf wicket is hard compacted clay mix strip with grass that is cut consistent with that of a golf green. The other alternative is to place artificial turf over a concrete base. Cricket pitch and cricket wicket are used interchangeably throughout this document

Cricket does not prescribe standard dimensions of the field itself, but international and first-class cricket (major league) require a diameter of 125 to 140 yards from the center of the wicket. Lake Fairfax Field 8 is one of the few fields that meet these criteria in the NOVA region.

With cricket growing and the introduction of major league cricket in the USA there is a demand of fields and pitches that meet international standards.

Lake Fairfax Cricket Field Maintenance and Condition

Over the years by agreement with FCPA, the parks have agreed to maintain the field (mowing) and the CAFC agreed to maintain the wicket. In past 20 years CAFC has replaced the artificial turf at their own cost 3 times. Unfortunately, the drainage around the pitch area is not good and the concrete base has bowed and is frequent waterlogged. Recent discussions with the park management have resulted in the determination that the wicket cannot be repaired, and a new wicket needs to be constructed with elevation and drainage to prevent water build up. Please see pictures of water logging in the area on July 14 with average rainfall the night before.





July 14, 2022

With FCPA approval CAFC is presenting Two Options which fall within the requested amount of \$20,000.

Option I – Construct a new Artificial Turf Wicket

This option will require the removal of the current concrete bases and artificial turf, and the relocation of the pitch to elevated area within the vicinity of the old pitch. The following are the phases of construction:

- 1. Removal and haulage of concrete base and artificial turf
- 2. Excavation of cricket pitch of 80 feet(L) x 10 feet(W) x 6 inches deep
- 3. Soil excavated will be used to cover existing pitch and elevate new pitch area
- 4. Laying of concrete base
- 5. Installing artificial turf over concrete base
- 6. Landscaping and reseeding area around the pitch and old pitch

We estimate that the process will take up 4 weeks to complete.

Option 2: Natural Turf Wicket

This option will require the removal of the current concrete bases and artificial turf, and the relocation of the pitch to elevated area within the vicinity of the old pitch. The following are the phases of construction:

- 1. Removal and haulage of concrete base and artificial turf
- 2. Excavation of cricket pitch of 80 feet(L) x 30 feet(W) x 6 inches deep
- 3. Soil excavated will be used to cover existing pitch and elevate new pitch area
- 4. Laying of sand/crushed gravel base (2 inches)
- 5. Overlay of cricket clay loam soil
- 6. Compacting area
- 7. Seeding pitch area with rye/fescue mix
- 8. Landscaping and reseeding area around d old pitch

<u>McLean Central Park – Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program Request – Friends of Thomas A. Mulquin (Dranesville District)</u>

ISSUE:

Approval of a Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant request from the Friends of Thomas A. Mulquin in the amount of \$20,000 to help fund a project to renovate the existing basketball court at McLean Central Park.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Park Authority Executive Director recommends approval of the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant request from the Friends of Thomas A. Mulquin in the amount of \$20,000 to help fund a project to renovate the existing basketball court at McLean Central Park.

TIMING:

Board action is requested on December 13, 2023, in order to award the grant.

BACKGROUND:

Friends and neighbors of Thomas A. Mulquin, who passed away at the age of 59 in May 2023, are motivated to honor his memory and the mark he made within the McLean community as an avid supporter of basketball. They founded the Friends of Thomas A. Mulquin and set about raising funds in the community to renovate the basketball court at McLean Central Park (Attachment 1). Improving the condition of the basketball court, which is currently underutilized, will provide area youth with an acceptable outdoor facility for practicing basketball skills. Ultimately, the court renovation project will serve to further advance the sport into which Thomas Mulquin invested energy and passion.

The existing basketball court, which is full size, has a condition assessment rating of D as determined by FCPA. Due to a chronic systemwide backlog of deferred maintenance, it is unknown when funding might become available for renovation of this court. Therefore, a Mastenbrook grant, along with a generous amount of funding to be provided by the Friends of Thomas A. Mulquin, offers a ready solution for funding renovation of this basketball court sooner than would be otherwise possible.

The project plan consists of refurbishing the existing court surface, fresh color coat application, line painting, replacing both goals, and adding a 10-foot black vinyl-coated chain link fence at one end to restrict balls from entering the adjacent dense vegetation. An accessible trail from the parking area is already in place. Park Authority staff have reviewed the project plan and determined that it meets required specifications. Staff

from the Park Operations Division will manage the court renovation project utilizing vendors contracted with the County.

The total project budget is \$65,176.50. Friends of Thomas A. Mulquin is requesting \$20,000 from the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Program (Attachment 2). If approved, the \$20,000 from the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant program, along with \$45,176.50 in funds raised by Friends of Thomas A. Mulquin, will complete the funding needed to implement the project. Sufficient funds are available in the Mastenbrook Matching Funds Grant program to award the grant.

The Park Authority Board Member for the Dranesville District supports approval of the grant request. Project construction is expected to be completed in Spring of 2024.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The estimated total project cost is \$65,176.50. Funds are currently available in the amount of \$20,000 in PR-000147, Park Renovations and Upgrades – 2020, in Fund 300-C30400, Park Bond Construction Fund; and \$45,176.50 from Friends of Thomas A. Mulquin, resulting in total available funding of \$65,176.50. Post-project maintenance expenses will be managed through existing operational resources.

Contingent on approval of this grant, the new balance in the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program will be \$637,060.

The basketball court is currently in disrepair and therefore seldom used. A tree root protrudes through the surface at one end of the court and a thicket downhill at the other end makes retrieving balls difficult and unsafe. The DMV is a basketball community, but McLean has neglected adequate facilities for the sport. Langley HS no longer has outdoor basketball courts and the courts at Langley Forks are in disrepair. The courts at McLean HS are inadequate for games.

The intended users are parents, girls, and boys throughout McLean.



ISSUE:

Approval of a Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant request from Spirit Open Equestrian in the amount of \$20,000 to help fund a project to install electrical service for the leased horse barns at Frying Pan Farm Park.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Park Authority Executive Director recommends approval of a Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant award to Spirit Open Equestrian in the amount of \$20,000 to help fund a project to install electrical service for the leased horse barns at Frying Pan Farm Park.

TIMING:

Board action is requested on December 13, 2023, in order to award the grant.

BACKGROUND:

Spirit Open Equestrian (SOE) is a non-profit organization that has long served the community by providing therapeutic riding, equine assisted psychotherapy and learning programs for individuals, families and groups. Through an agreement with the Fairfax County Park Authority, SOE offers therapeutic riding programs for the public at Frying Pan Farm Park and leases an area within the park for its operations.

The leased area encompasses four horse barns containing fourteen horse stalls; three sheds for feed stores, tools and equipment; and an office. This area currently has no electrical service. Existing solar panels are inadequate for providing a consistent, reliable energy supply to meet vital needs, such as cooling of participants and horses in warm seasons. In the Fall, Winter and early Spring, the frequent lack of sunlight limits charging of the solar panels, causing chronic power and light outages.

SOE desires to pursue a project to equip the leased operations area with electrical power (Attachment 1). SOE is requesting \$20,000 from the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grants Program to help fund the completion of the project (Attachment 2). The project plan proposes to have Dominion Energy extend power from an existing cell tower, and then to contract with a vendor to outfit the buildings with wiring, conduit, outlets and related electrical components.

The total project budget is \$72,458. If approved, the \$20,000 Mastenbrook grant, along with a contribution of \$52,458 from SOE, will provide the funds needed to complete the

project. Sufficient funds are available in the Mastenbrook Matching Funds Grant program to award the grant. Maintenance expenses will be managed through existing operational funding.

The Park Authority Board Member for the Hunter Mill District supports approval of the grant request. The project will be managed by the Park Operations Division and is expected to be completed by Spring 2024.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The estimated total project cost is \$72,458. Funds are currently available in the amount of \$20,000 in WBS PR-000147, Park Renovations and Upgrades-2020, Fund 300-C30400, Park Bond Construction Fund; and \$52,458 from Spirit Open Equestrian, resulting in total available funding of \$72,458.

Contingent on approval of this grant, the remaining balance in the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program will be \$617,060.


