# **Frequently Asked Questions**

Life in Historic Virginia

## Virginia Standards Covered

## **Kindergarten**

  - The student will investigate and understand that change occurs over time and rates may be fast or slow.

  - The student will sequence events in the past and present and recognize that things changing over time.

## **PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**

## 1. The Farm Family

- Students learn about the concept of the "past" and how it applies to their life and the story of the farm.
  - $\,\circ\,$  Compare and contrast similarities and differences to various time periods.
  - $\circ$  Learn about the typical day of a farm child in the 1920's.
  - Learn how farmers grew their own food, the methods they used to move around Fairfax County, and what they did for recreation.
  - $\circ$  Students will perform historic "chores" from the past such as doing historic laundry and will get a tour of our historic farmhouse.

## 2. Each field trip consists of the following components

- 1 hour staff-lead program. The program will be held for 30 minutes in our "barn classroom" and 30 minutes in our "outside classroom"
- Self-guided farm activity: 30 minutes
- Schools may add on an additional 30 min wagon ride at \$3/per person

## 3. How much walking is involved?

• Students may walk up to a 1/2 mile throughout the entire program.

## 4. How much of the program is outdoors?

- The first 30 minutes of the program are in the barn classroom, the next 30 minutes are outside.
- The farm activity sheet is all outside.
- School field trip programs run rain or shine. In case of excessive rain, your program is moved inside.

# 5. How do schools pay for the program?

- An invoice will be sent with your confirmation letter.
- Please bring this invoice along to submit with your program payment.
- One teacher will bring the payment on the day of program (unless paid ahead of time). Receipts are available upon request.
- Payment may be made by cash, check payable to FCPA, and Credit Card.

## 6. How much does the program cost?

• The program fee is \$6 per person (in-county), \$7 per student (out-of-county).
