

What About the Animals?



One of the most frequently asked questions during the COVID-19 shutdown was, "What about the animals?" Soon you can see for yourself how the Park Authority's beloved animals fared while parks were closed. As of press time, nature centers and historic sites were preparing to open in the third phase of the Park Authority's plan to resume operations for the first time since March.

During the months-long park closure, the animals at Fryng Pan Farm Park got full attention from the farmer and full-time staff members who were cross-trained to cover all farm chores and keep the animals safe in the event regular caretakers were to become ill.

"We have feed lists posted explaining which animals get what, and that is always in flux," said park manager Yvonne Johnson. "For example, animals that are expecting babies are fed according to one list, and mothers who have delivered their babies are fed according to a different list to address their changing needs."

Inside nature centers, exhibit animals were fed and cared for as usual by trained park staff during the shutdown. All are alive and well and ready to receive visitors as soon as the parks open.
