
## **Park Preschool Program Expands**



It's easy to see why Park Authority preschool programs at Lee District and Spring Hill RECenters are so popular – even in the midst of a pandemic. Spacious, colorful classrooms and a cheerful welcoming atmosphere make our licensed, accredited preschools seem like home away from home for children ages 3 to 5. Child-sized furniture, kid-friendly activities and dedicated instructors make for fun and nurturing places to learn.

"It's phenomenal," said Héctor Salazar Salame who enrolled his 4-year-old son, Xavier, in the Spring Hill preschool in September. "The program has been top-notch, the facility is very clean and there are a lot of [COVID-19] safety protocols in place, which gave us a lot of confidence from day one."

Parents whose children are enrolled in the Lee District program say they are equally impressed with both the instruction and the preschool environment.



Plans to expand the half-day preschool programs were in the works prior to the pandemic to accommodate a growing number of children who were on waiting lists. Beginning this fall, both programs will add classrooms, and both will continue to follow health safety protocols recommended by the CDC and the Fairfax County Health Department.

"So far, I feel comfortable with the COVID-19 [safety] procedures put in place," said another parent who responded to the survey. "My child always comes home excited to tell me all that was done/learned each day of school."

Class sizes are kept small so that students can receive more personalized instruction. Both two-day and three-day programs are offered at both locations. By the time the children graduate, parents say they are well prepared for the next step.
