The Kruger Brothers (Folk)

Born and raised in Europe, brothers Jens and Uwe Kruger started singing and playing instruments at a very young age. Growing up in a family where music was an important part of life, they were exposed to a wide diversity of musical influences. The brothers were performing regularly by the time they were eleven and twelve years old, and they began their professional career in 1979. Jens' and Uwe's first public performances were as a duo, and in just a few years they were busking on the streets of cities throughout eastern and western Europe. CBS Records contracted with Jens and Uwe when Jens was just seventeen years old, and shortly thereafter, the Krugers hosted a radio show on SRG SSR, the Swiss Public broadcast group. Several years later, the brothers teamed up with bass player Joel Landsberg, a native of New York City who also had a very extensive musical upbringing in classical and

jazz music (studying with jazz great Milt Hinton), thus forming a trio that has been playing professionally together since 1995. Together, they established the incomparable sound that The Kruger Brothers are known for today. The trio moved to the United States in 2002 and is based in Wilkesboro, NC. Since their formal introduction to American audiences in 1997, The Kruger Brothers' remarkable discipline, creativity and their ability to infuse classical music into folk music has resulted in a unique sound that has made them a fixture within the world of acoustic music. The honesty of their writing has since become a hallmark of the trio's work. In their ever-expanding body of work – Jens Kruger (banjo and vocals), Uwe Kruger (guitar and lead vocals), and Joel Landsberg, (bass and vocals) – The Kruger Brothers personify the spirit of exploration and innovation that forms the core of the American musical tradition. Their original music is crafted around their discerning taste, and the result is unpretentious, cultivated, and delightfully fresh.

The concept of "holy math" which informs that line -- and the album's title -- was inspired by a Justin Vernon appearance on the *Song Exploder* podcast, where the Bon Iver leader talked about the interconnectedness of humans. "We're all together, and that's just the way it is, and the way it always will be," says Caws. "That's the sacred truth of it." That idea of being linked and searching for connection is a common theme of the album's lyrics, which depict people hunting down answers by peering within and reaching outward. "Looking For You," which opens with a spectral choir and blossoms into a rock spectacle with crashing strings and two guitar solos -- one played by Caws, the other by frequent *Nada Surf* collaborator Doug Gillard -- seeks solace in doctor's visits and grand metaphors. "So Much Love," which Caws wrote as part of Hits president Karen Glauber's annual SXSW session, is a driving, yet kind-hearted reminder that love and connection are in the air -- even if, in the immediate, it's lurking in the mists of one's sent-messages mailbox. *Never Not Together* was recorded at Rockfield Studios in Wales, where artists like Echo & the Bunnymen, the Flamin' Groovies, Iggy Pop and Oasis recorded albums. "I've been seeing the name on albums for so long," says Caws. "It's a working farm, and the founder/owner, Kingsley Ward, would come in and tell us stories when he wasn't farming. I'd walk into town every morning and listen to the sheep talking as I walked by them." That openness to listening -- to their fans, to each other, to the world -- has helped inform *Nada Surf's* legacy as down-to-earth rock stars -- musicians who can command festival stages around the world while connecting to audience members on a personal level, conscious of the shared humanity every step of the way.

Raiford Starke, wrote the soulful, "West Memphis," and the band stylistically took it to Memphis. Stutso came up with, "Gas Station Chicken," and everyone contributed to bringing in the funk. Hovey added three more: "Houseband," "Fuss and Fight," and the acoustic delight, "Driving." In between are British pub rock monster, Gariant Watkins' "Nobody," Jimmy Reed's "Take it Easy, featuring producer David Earl contributing the Eddie Taylor licks on guitar; Eddie Hinton's version of Sam Cook's "I'll Come Running Back"; John Hammond's version of Mose Allison's "Ask Me Nice"; a wild version of reggae classic, "Johnny Too Bad"; an outtake rendition of Elvin Presley's "Ain't That Lovin' You"; a Hillbilly interpretation of the Coasters' "Run Red Run"; and half a dozen others that fell by the wayside. They'd play, record, rearrange, and re-record until they got them just right. In the tradition they set forth on Rock and Roll, the band's debut 1974 recording and mission statement, the material is not bound by genre, other than the widest range of American Roots Music.
