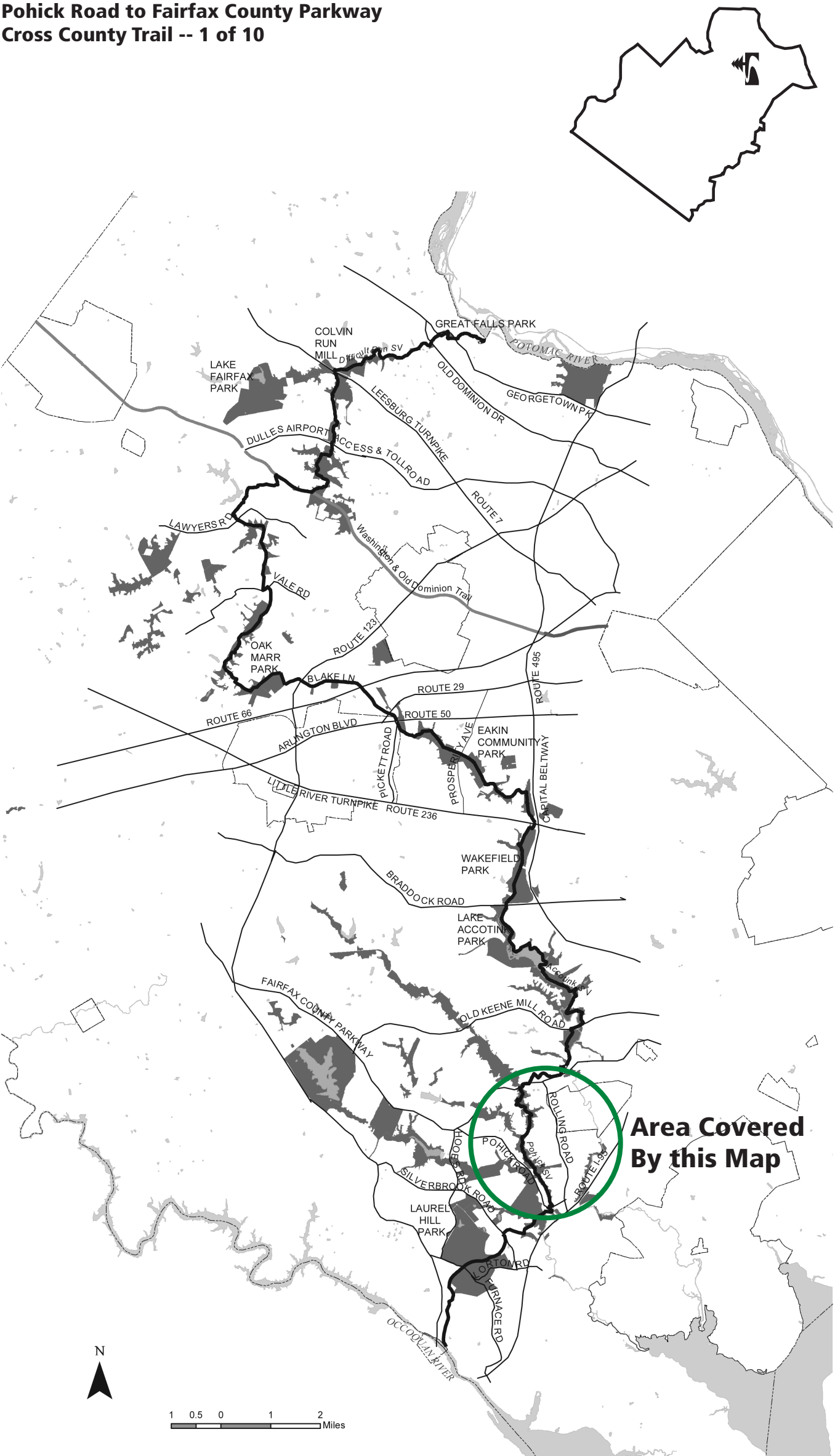


Pohick Stream Valley Trail

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POHICK STREAM VALLEY TRAIL
is part of the countywide trail plan. It is also a component of the Cross County Trail which stretches across the county from south to north. It links through the Laurel Hill Greenway to the Occoquan River in the south, and with Accotink Stream Valley and Difficult Run Stream Valley to the Potomac River at Great Falls Park in the north.

This section of the CCT runs between Pohick Road and the Fairfax County Parkway for a distance of approximately 3 miles. Mile Markers as shown on the map are approximate. Access points for this section of trail are through neighborhoods along the trail as shown on the map – several of the access trails are very steep. The trail surface varies – parts are asphalt, parts are stonedust, and a few small sections are natural surface. The trail varies in steepness, with a few sections being quite steep. Stream crossings are mostly fairweather crossings, but there are also two wooden bridges on one section of the main trail.

An asphalt trail runs along the east and north sides of Pohick Road and provides the connection to Creekside View Lane and the Laurel Hill Greenway.

There is limited parking beyond the southern end of the trail at the cul-de-sac of Wadebrook Terrace (at the end of Rolling Road). There is also limited parking along Hooes Road, paralleling the Fairfax County Parkway on the northern end of this segment. There are no service facilities on this stretch of trail.
