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Policy Plan Amendment Project Overview




On December 6, 2022, the Board of Supervisors (Board) authorized a Plan amendment to review and update the entire Comprehensive Plan Policy Plan (Policy Plan) which was established in 1990. The Policy Plan, edited and amended in parts since adoption, needs a holistic update to ensure continued relevancy and applicability as a guidance document for all land development in Fairfax County.

As directed by the Board, the goals of a complete Policy Plan update are to:

- 1. Review, update, and streamline existing Policy Plan elements;
- 2. Add new Policy Plan elements as needed; and
- 3. Ensure the Policy Plan is in alignment with the Countywide Strategic Plan (Strategic Plan), the One Fairfax Policy, and other recently adopted policies and initiatives.

<u>Phase I Topics:</u> Preface, Land Use, Transportation, Environment, Parks & Recreation, Equity, Community Health, and Human Services.

<u>Phase II Topics:</u> Housing, Economic Development, Heritage Resources, and Revitalization, Visual & Performing Arts.








Policy Plan Amendment Land Use



- Full element has been restructured. Appendices absorbed into Plan text.
- Updated policies to align with trends for office, retail, and industrial uses.
- New policies and topics within Land Use Element:
 - Suburban Village Centers
 - Data Centers
 - Equitable Development
 - Placemaking and Arts















Policy Plan Amendment Transportation



- Full element has been restructured.
 - Streamlined to 10 objectives with supporting policy recommendations.
- Updated appendices 1-4 and maps.
- More explicit promotion of active transportation, safety, and equity.
- Recognition of the relationship with land use and environment.
- Emphasis on Comprehensive Transportation Assessments (CTA) and multimodal connections.











Policy Plan Amendment Environment Element Changes



- Updated policies to align with CECAP and Resilient Fairfax.
 - LEED Certified to LEED Silver for residential development in activity centers.
 - Emphasis on climate resiliency and adaption.
- Formalized policies:
 - R-C District 50% undisturbed open space.
 - Bird-friendly design.
 - Natural landscaping.
- New objective and policies for equity.
- Development of countywide stormwater management guidance.













Policy Plan Amendment Environment - Proposed Countywide Stormwater Management Guidance: Menu of Options



Water Quality Control

a. Retain the first inch of rainfall on-site. If, on a given site, the retention on-site of the first inch of rainfall is demonstrated not to be fully achievable, all available measures should be implemented to the extent practical.

b. Provide stormwater management measures that are sufficient to attain the Rainwater Management credit in the most current version of LEED.



Water Quantity Control

a. Mimic undeveloped (good forested) conditions to the maximum extent practicable, to not generate excess stream power that alters channel morphology or increases erosion, and to reduce flood risk.

b. For development with impervious surfaces at or exceeding 40%: reduce the peak runoff rate for the 2-year 24-hour storm in the existing condition by at least 30%

c. For development with impervious surfaces below 40%: reduce the peak runoff rate for the 2-year 24-hour storm in the existing condition by at least 20%

And use the Energy Balance method to reduce the peak runoff rate to good forested condition when warranted by downstream conditions.













Policy Plan Amendment Parks & Recreation



- Updates to address equity and incorporate the Parks, Recreation, Open Space, and Access (PROSA) Strategy into the element.
 - Improve 10-minute walk access to FCPA Parks.
 - Enrich habitat connectivity between environmental corridors.
 - Enhance access to complete park experiences.
 - Analyze and prioritize recreation needs and projects with an equity lens.



 Phase II will include updates to levels of park service standards, park classifications, urban parks policies and guidelines, and resource management.
