The Lorton-Community Vision Statement calls for a mixed-use, Core Area ("town center") formed around a group of Activity Nodes that will emphasize placemaking and experiential elements with new development that can provide community gathering spaces.

The Lorton Vision will inform the Fairfax County Comprehensive Plan amendment process. The Comprehensive Plan update will include **new policies to guide development character and transportation strategies** for decades to come.

The Lorton Vision reflects years of public input calling for the creation of more vibrant places in the community to gather, live, shop and recreate. It also identifies transportation improvements that will make it more convenient to walk, bike, use transit and rely less on cars for every trip.

The Lorton Vision policy changes will help this part of the county position itself to **capture a bigger share of the region's growth**. Bringing **more residential rooftops to Lorton** will bring more people to our community which in turn can help support **more thriving local businesses**, **and centers of activity where people want to be**. Bringing more housing to our area will also help us to provide a range of **housing options** for all income levels and household types.

The Lorton Vision presented at today's open house calls for the designation of new Activity Centers where future growth and redevelopment could happen over time. It also includes ideas about what that development character could look like, and the transportation options needed in the future. Based on what you have seen today, did we get it right?
