

Multimodal Integration	Focus on integrating motorized and non-motorized transportation to reduce single-occupancy vehicle (SOV) use and improve air quality.			
Public Transit Expansion	Support the extension of Metrorail and development of public transit options like HOV lanes and park-and-ride lots in key corridors.			
Pedestrian and Bicycle Infrastructure	Develop a comprehensive network of sidewalks, trails, and bike routes with safe, accessible features.			
Transportation Demand Management (TDM)	Promote alternatives to SOV travel, such as public transit, ridesharing, biking, and teleworking.			
Context-Sensitive Roadway Design	Ensure roadways provide adequate access and capacity while being sensitive to environmental and community impacts.
