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Chairman Cortina called the meeting to order at 8:49 p.m. in Conference Room 11 of the Fairfax County Government Center, 12000 Government Center Parkway, Fairfax, Virginia 22035.

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Chairman Cortina announced that tonight's meeting would feature a presentation from Fairfax County Department of Transportation (FCDOT) staff regarding the upcoming plan amendments, PA 2021-CW-T2 and PA 2019-III-T1, Fairfax County and Franconia-Springfield Parkways/Fairfax County Parkway at Burke Centre Parkway.

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Chairman Cortina announced that the minutes for the December 9, 2021 Transportation Committee meeting was before the committee for approval and entertained a motion for approval. Commissioner Sargeant MOVED TO APPROVE THE TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE MINUTES FOR DECEMBER 9, 2021.

Commissioner Bennett seconded the motion, which carried by a vote of 4-0. Commissioners Clarke and Lagana were absent from the meeting.

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Thomas Burke, Department of Transportation (FCDOT); Michael Garcia, FCDOT; and Jeffrey Hermann, FCDOT gave a PowerPoint Presentation on the Plan Amendment for Fairfax County Parkways at Franconia-Springfield Parkway and at Burke Centre Parkway, a copy of which is included in Attachment A, which covered the following topics:

- A general overview of this effort, including the purpose, timeline, and processes followed:
- Overview of key takeaways from the public engagement process and operational analyses;
- Considerations for multimodal forms of transportation including both bicycle/pedestrian and transit;
- Review staff's findings and final recommendations for Fairfax County Parkway, which was organized into the following five segments:
  - o Route 7 to Franklin Farm Road;
  - o Franklin Farm Road to Route 123;
  - o Route 123 to Franconia-Springfield Parkway;
  - o Franconia-Springfield Parkway to Richmond Highway; and
  - o Fairfax County Parkway to Beulah Street.
- Review of the timeline for implementation and associated costs;
- Review of the next steps including consideration of the proposed plan amendments by the Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors.

There was a discussion between Mr. Burke, Mr. Garcia, Mr. Hermann, and multiple Committee members on the following issues:

- Clarification on whether staff studied cost saving measures regarding the reduction of intersections in the proposed plan amendment;
- Discussion on whether the Burke Center Conservancy was satisfied with the solution staff provided to their concerns;
- Clarification on the plan for the Route 123/West Ox Road interchange on Segment 3, which was intended to move traffic more efficiently;
- Discussion on the timeline for implementation on the plan amendment proposals for Segment 4, which included the Franconia/Springfield Parkway to Richmond Highway interchange;
- Concern regarding potential safety concerns regarding the traffic flow from industrial development along the Fairfax County Parkway in the event of an emergency;
- Concerns regarding the current structure of the single lane underpass on Segment 4 near the Embassy Hotel and the train tracks;
- Concerns regarding signage on parts of Segment 5, particularly at the intersections of Rolling Road and the Fairfax County Parkway;
- Concerns regarding pedestrian/bicycle access on the Cross County Trail (CCT) and there being no way for passage without crossing 10 lanes of traffic;

- Discussion on whether the speed limit for parts of Fairfax County Parkways managed by VDOT was still 55 MPH and if that would be a concern for future implementation of this proposal;
- The extent to which modifications along the Fairfax County Parkway supported and complemented existing development;
- Discussion on the community-based planning process that resulted in this proposal, how staff addressed community feedback/concerns, and how they intended to work with the various resource limitations;
- Confirmation that there would be additional opportunities for public comment before the plan amendments go before the Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors for consideration;
- Clarification on whether the County was able to access additional federal infrastructure funding;
- Discussion on how the Comprehensive Plan could be amended to include electric vehicles (EV) and charging stations technology as a priority;
- Discussion on the funding opportunities available for the County to invest in EV infrastructure;
- Discussion on the gaps between applicant/development approval and the County's transportation priorities;
- The possibility for further coordination between staff, the Virginia Department of Transportation, and the community to evaluate issues related to speed limits and transportation improvement priorities; and
- Request from the Commission for more frequent briefings between the Committee and FCDOT staff on the County's transportation infrastructure priorities and long-term vision.

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Chairman Cortina thanked staff and adjourned the meeting.
