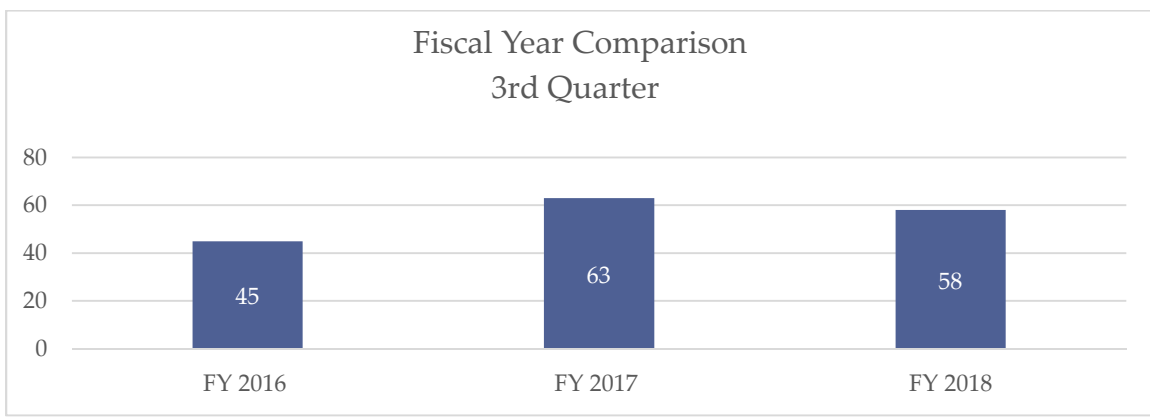
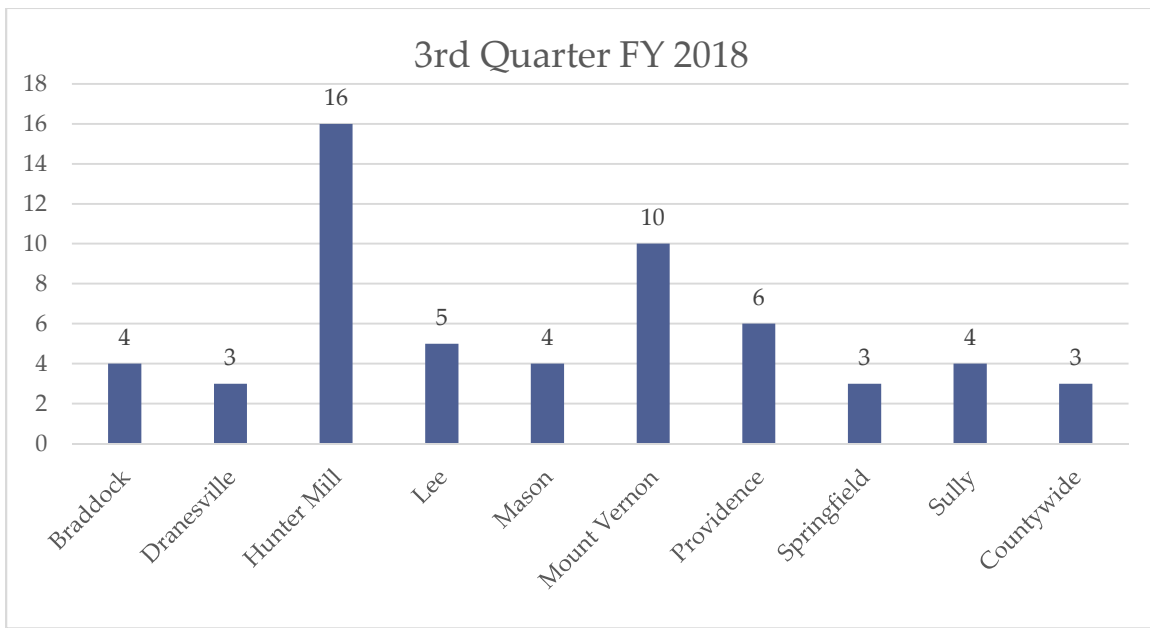

During the 3rd Quarter of Fiscal Year 2018 the Planning Commission took action on 58 applications; affording 87 citizens an opportunity to speak in person at the 14 public hearings held. The district with the most actions taken during this period was the Hunter Mill District, with 16 actions taken.

Land Use Activities in the Braddock District – Broadcast March and April 2018

Committee Activity

Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Committee - On February 21st the Capital Improvement Program Committee met to receive a presentation on the FY 2019 – FY 2023 CIP. The Committee also met on March 14th to discuss the responses to questions raised during the CIP Workshop that was held on March 7, 2018.

Land Use Process Review Committee - On January 17th the Land Use Process Review Committee met to discuss the proposed Zoning Ordinance Amendment for Short-Term Lodging. The Committee also met on February 7th for a briefing by the Zoning Administration Division staff on the proposed Sign Ordinance Amendment and held a discussion with the Planning Division staff on the proposed Plan Amendment, PA 2017-CW-5CP, regarding Vacant Office Building Repurposing. On March 14th the Committee was constituted for 2018 where James T. Migliaccio was elected Chairman. During that same meeting, the Committee was briefed by the Planning Division staff on the Site-Specific Plan Amendment Process.

Schools Committee – On January 17th the Schools Committee met with staff from Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) to discuss the proffer contribution calculations, schools capacity, and construction goals. On February 21st the Committee was constituted for 2018 where Timothy J. Sargeant was elected Chairman and Julie M. Strandlie was elected Vice Chairman. The Committee continued a discussion with staff from FCPS on the proffer formulas for capital improvements, use of vacant and/or underutilized County properties for FCPS facilities, collaboration of FCPS with businesses, and economic development initiatives.



On April 13th the Planning Commission and members of the community toured the Virginia Paving Company asphalt plant in Alexandria Virginia.

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
