




Note: Community Member initiated contacts are calls for service that are dispatched through the Fairfax County Department of Public Safety Communications. Officer initiated contacts are self-dispatched by officers when observing a criminal act, conducting a traffic or subject stop, responding to stolen vehicle alerts, or when involved in planned events such as narcotics operations or warrant services. More than one individual may be involved in a Use of force incident resulting in a higher number of involved individuals than actual.




NOTE: A use of force incident will often involve more than one instrument or technique, as well as multiple officers, therefore, the number of tools and techniques used will not be equal to the number of incidents. Also note as of August 2022 documentation for Pointed Firearm, Spit Hood, Bolawrap, Limb Immobilization, vehicle stopping techniques such as tactical vehicle intercept and stop sticks was adjusted and are now documented as reportable actions in lieu of use of force.





2021 Assault on Fairfax County Police Officers



Aggravated and Simple Assault on Fairfax County Police Officers






