




County Resident vs. Non-County Resident



2022 Use of Force by Contact Type









Also note as of August 2022 documentation for Pointed Firearm, Spit Hood, Bolawrap, Limb Immobilization, vehicle stopping techniques such as tactical vehicle intercept and stop sticks was adjusted and are now documented as reportable actions in lieu of use of force.


2022 Assault on Fairfax County Police Officers






