FAIRFAX COUNTY POLICE OFFICERS WERE DISPATCHED TO ASSIST US PARK POLICE UNITS THAT WERE ACTIVELY IN A PURSUIT OF A VEHICLE THAT WAS INVOLVED IN A "HIT AND RUN ACCIDENT".

INFORMATION THAT WAS BEING RELAYED TO FAIRFAX COUNTY UNITS WERE THAT THE PURSUIT WAS TRAVELLING SOUTH BOUND ON THE GEORGE WASHINGTON PKWY. ADVISED THAT HAD JUST CAUGHT UP TO THE PURSUIT AND WAS BEHIND THE US PARK POLICE UNIT. UPDATED THEIR LOCATION TO BE ON ALEXANDRIA AVE AND FORT HUNT RD. ■ THEN ADVISED THAT THE SUSPECT HAD WRECKED AND THAT US PARK POLICE UNITS HAD FIRED SHOTS. ONCE I GOT ONSCENE. I OBSERVED A DARK COLORED SUV THAT APPEARED TO HAVE RUN OFF THE SIDE OF THE ROAD INTO THE DITCH ON THE NORTH BOUND SIDE OF FORT HUNT RD AND ALEXANDRIA AVE. A US PARK PD OFFICER WAS AT THE DRIVER'S SIDE WINDOW OF THE DARK COLORED SUV (SUSPECT'S VEHICLE) AND WAS ATTEMPTING TO FREE THE DRIVER FROM THE VEHICLE BY SMASHING OUT THE DRIVER'S SIDE WINDOW WITH BATON. IT WAS LEARNED THAT THE DRIVER MAY HAVE BEEN SHOT SO THE US PARK PD OFFICER WAS ATTEMPTING TO EXTRACATE THE DRIVER TO RENDER AID, OFFICERS ONSCENE ALSO ADVISED THAT SUSPECT MAY HAVE BEEN INJURED AND REQUESTED FOR RESCUE TO RESPOND. OFFICERS WERE ABLE TO EXTRACATE THE DRIVER AND BEGAN TO RENDER AID. FIRE DEPT PERSONNEL ARRIVED AND THE DRIVER OF THE FLEEING VEHICLE WAS TRANSPORTED TO FAIRFAX HOSPITAL BY AMBO/MEDIC (ALEXANDRIA CITY FIRE DEPT). I WAS ABLE TO FOLLOW AMBO/MEDIC TO FAIRFAX HOSPITAL. ONSCENE AT FAIRFAX HOSPITAL. THE DRIVER/SUSPECT WAS RUSHED TO TRAUMA ROOM #1 WHERE HE WAS BEING TREATED. THE DRIVER/SUSPECT WAS EVENTUALLY TRANSPORTED TO THE THIRD FLOOR (ROOM F-3.12/I.C.U.) WHERE HE WAS CONTINUED TO BE TREATED. ADVISED THAT THE DRIVER/SUSPECT'S CONDITION WAS NOT SURVIVABLE. IT APPEARED THAT THE DRIVER/SUSPECT HAD SUFFERED MUTIPLE GUN SHOTS TO AND THERE WAS STILL THAT REMAINED IN THE THERE WAS ALSO A BULLET WOUND TO THE DRIVER/SUSPECT`S MET US AT FAIRAX HOSPITAL AND BECAUSE **WAS SUPPLEMENTAL CRIME SCENE** ASSISTED DET. (US PARK POLICE) WHO WOULD BE INVESTIGATING THEIR OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTING. DET. (CRIME SCENE DETECTIVE) ARRIVED AND RELIEVED ME FROM FAIRFAX HOSPITAL.

On November 17 at approximately 21:45 hours I received a call-out reference this case. I responded to the intersection of Fort Hunt Rd and Alexandria Avenue. Once there, I was asked to pull the "In Car Video" from the SUV bearing County Police Vehicle number. After gaining access to the rear of that vehicle I found that it was equipped with the newer Mark II video system. This newer system does not contain removable storage media. Instead, it contains bays for two "Solid State Drives" (SSDs). When the system access door was opened by an IA supervisor only one SSD bay had a drive installed. The other bay was empty. The CFS has not had any training on this newer type of ICV system. The last information we received regarding this system was that we were not to pull the SSD's or copy the media from the drive. I relayed this fact to the supervisors on scene. The MKII housing was re-closed by the IA supervisor and I took no other actions connected to that vehicle.

Next, I was asked to check the Ford cruiser bearing County Police Vehicle number . That vehicle had the older MKI ICV system with a removable 32GB Panasonic SD card. The video system's housing was opened by the IA supervisor and I took possession of the 32 GB SD card. The usual notes and photographs were taken as I secured the card in a Manilla envelope. I took the SD card back to the CFS facility where I imaged the card's contents via the forensic software platform. The card's original contents were protected by my use of a software write-blocked USB 3.0 port during the imaging process. I also activated the card's write protection slide lock. The slide lock was returned to its original position once the imaging process was complete and its success verified.

The image files were loaded into the same software and I located the target video file. The file was quickly viewed by myself, a representative from the Park Police and another IA supervisor. Once that was complete I made two copies of the video. These two copies were burned onto optical media (Disks) along with a copy of the video viewer program. The disks were labeled per my usual routine. Both disks were quickly checked by inserting them into my County-issued Dell PC to make sure the video would run. I also took the opportunity to show the Park Police officer how to access and play the video using the included player program on the disk. When that was done, I gave one disk to the Park Police representative and one to the IA supervisor. I also gave the IA supervisor the Manilla envelope with the original 32 GB SD card.

The original image file from the SD card is included in an electronic case file on my unit. That case file is named The pre-examination photographs that I took of the SD card have been included in that case file. Appropriate entries have been made in the CFS.

On 11-17-2017 I responded to the intersection of Fort Hunt Road and Alexandria Ave reference an Officer Involved Shooting. I arrived on scene around 2130hrs and meet with the lead investigators Detective Sergeant and Detective Sergeant that their crime scene investigators would be handling the documentation of the shooting incident but would like our assistance with documenting the deceased at Fairfax Hospital. than assigned Detective to respond to Fairfax Hospital and assist USPP with documenting the deceased. (See Detective more detail of mactions reference this incident).
I than spoke to USPP Crime Scene Investigator and offer any crime scene assistance at the scene which stated they did not need any except for obtaining the video footage from the Fairfax County Police Cruisers. I than contacted Second Lieutenant who then called out Detective and and Detective from the Computer Forensics Section. I then meet Detective at the scene and introduced to Crime Scene Investigator and Detective Sergeant who then assisted USPP as needed. I then spoke to Internal Affairs investigators who advised me that they wanted a Crime Scene Detective to respond to Mount Vernon Police Station and document all the Fairfax County Police Officers involved with this incident. I than assigned Detective to this task who then responded and documented all the officers involved (See Detective report for more detail of actions reference this incident).
I than stayed on scene until the documentation of this incident by USPP was finished. The only assistance I gave was to make sure our officers have the appropriate roads closed so they could conduct their investigations. No further action was taken by me and below is a list of other Crime Scene Detectives and a Supplemental Crime Scene Officer who were either on scene or assisted with this investigation.
Detective and Detective from our crime scene unit did respond to the scene off of Fort Hunt Road but no action were taken by them since our assistance was not needed and they were told by me to go back in service. PFC who who is a supplemental crime scene officer was working patrol out of Station and did respond to Fairfax Hospital for the incoming patient from this shooting incident. On November 22, 2017 I was watching the 11:00 P.M. Fox Channel 5 News when a story came on about this event. This was the first news story I had seen or heard since the incident.
From my previous experience of being on our police department's Peer Support Team and working directly with Dr. (one of the department's past psychologists) on several Officer Involved Shootings (OIS), attending multiple classes given by the International Critical
Incident Stress Foundation (ICISF), attending a two day seminar by the Force Science Research Center and reading several Force Science News articles related to OIS and
I saw the Park Police officer standing on the driver's side of the Jeep start to shoot. After watching this officer shoot 2-3 rounds, I immediately focused on the Jeep's rear hatch and back doors to watch for a bailout of possibly armed individuals. With
my visual concentration on the rear of the Jeep, I heard multiple shots being fired rapidly. Due to the number, speed and staccato pace of the gun shots I believed both officers were firing. When the shooting stopped, I watched the Jeep roll slowly to the right and into the ditch. After the Jee rolled into the ditch I saw the second Park Police officer standing at the front, driver's side corner of the Jeep with weapon drawn and saw, I believed, three bullet strikes to the windshield. I concluded the second Park Police officer discharged those rounds before the Jeep rolled into the
ditch.
I tried to enter this supplement into ILEADS on November 25, 2017, but found "no match" when I searched for case #2017 321 0249. I

concluded this case must be "locked" for this investigation.

I responded to the GW Parkway area for an assistance request by Park PD who was actively pursing a vehicle into the county. I had just passed the intersection of Fort Hunt Rd./Alexandria Ave. when the radio traffic updated to say that the pursuit had turned onto Alexandria Ave from the GW Parkway. I turned around and turned onto Alexandria Ave where I stopped my car (full emergency equipment activated) and attempted to deploy stop sticks from behind my cruiser. I was unable to get the stop sticks deployed before the pursuit passed my cruiser and so I returned to my cruiser, turned around and caught up to the the pursuit at Fort Hunt/Alexandria. Upon arrival I observed the Park PD cruiser stopped in a perpendicular manner across Alexandria in what appeared to be an attempt to block the fleeing vehicles path. When exiting my vehicle I heard several gun shots and responded to the area in between the rear of the Park PD cruiser and the front of cruiser in an effort to assist PD with the situation. One Park PD officer was seen at the vehicles driver door and one was seen in front of the vehicle, both with guns drawn and giving commands. The offending vehicle was seen attempting to maneuver around the Park PD cruiser while the Park PD officer was attempting to open the vehicles door. As the vehicle attempted to drive around the cruiser the Park PD officer fired into the vehicle. Shortly after, the vehicle then idled off the roadway and into a ditch where it became stuck and was leaning onto its passenger side. I then took a position in front of the vehicle to maintain cover of the driver while Park PD worked to break the driver-side window in an effort to open the door. From my position the driver was seen slumped over towards the passenger side and appeared unresponsive. He was seen After Park PD got the door open myself and OFC pulled the subject from the vehicle in an effort to render aid. The seat belt was cut in the process. The subject was found with a and no other obvious injuries were seen. He was placed on the ground on his left side in an effort to from his mouth that had accumulated. Rescue personnel arrived shortly after and took over aid. I patted the subject down for safety and nothing was found. After Rescue took over I turned off the vehicles engine via push button stop/start. I then remained on scene to brief our supervisors as well as Park PDs supervisors.

One 40 Cal magazine was inserted in the firearm, containing twelve cartridges / capacity of twelve. The hammer was resting forward. Two 40 Cal magazines from the vest containing twelve cartridges each / capacity of twelve. The Firearms Documentation Forms were completed at the scene and copies were provided to Detective PHOTOGRAPHY: The officers were photographed with a Nikon digital SLR camera. The images were transferred to a DVD which was placed on file in the Record Room. A copy of the DVD was provided to Detective and a copy was placed in my case file.

Supplement Notes

On the listed date I responded to police service for a Park Police unit in a traffic pursuit. The unit stated was traveling south on George Washington Pkwy so I drove down the area Collingwood and Fort Hunt road. Once at this intersection it was stated over the radio that the pursuit had gotten off the Parkway at Tulane rd. I then head north to the intersection of Fort Hunt and Wellington. That was when it came over the radio that the pursuit was stopped at Fort hunt and Alexandria. Moments later it was advised that Park Police had discharged their weapons. I arrived on scene just minutes after the shooting occurred and positioned my cruiser to the rear of the Park Police cruiser on the south side of the intersection. I then exited my cruiser and approached the vehicle which was currently in the ditch on the side of Alexandria Ave. I witnessed one of the Park PD officer attempting to break the driver window in order to gain entry into the vehicle. They were able to gain entry into the vehicle unlocking the door through the break in the window. Once the door was opened I was standing directly to the side of the side vehicle The inside of the vehicle was viewed and determined that there were no weapons in plain view or reach of the driver. The rear of the vehicle was also checked with no weapons seen, no other passengers were observed in the vehicle either. There were no drug or narcotics visible to from plain view but I did not search the vehicle. The driver of the vehicle was unresponsive and it was observed that there was a gunshot wound to the of the driver. There was also a substantial amount of The drivers breathing at this time appeared be and determined by myself and Lt removed from the vehicle and placed on the ground in the recovery position in case there were any fluids blocking his airway. The seat belt was and I then removed him from the vehicle and placed him on roadway in front of the Park Police cruiser. The driver was then also checked for any other wounds on his body but no others were located. Rescue was also summoned to the scene by this time to render aid to the driver and they were advised of his condition over radio. Rescue arrived and then rendered aid and then transported him to the Fairfax hospital.

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
