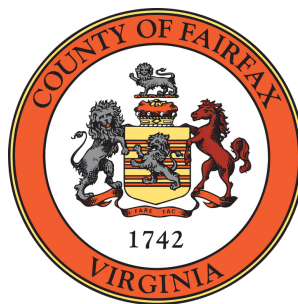

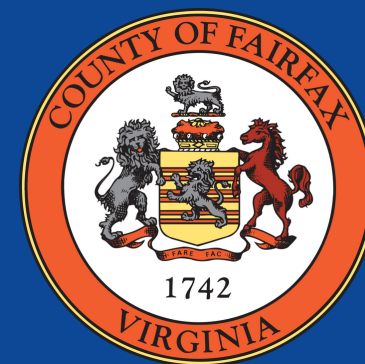

## What is the Police Civilian Review Panel?

The Fairfax County Police Civilian Review Panel was established to review police investigations resulting from public complaints against officers of the Fairfax County Police Department. The Panel consists of nine members who are Fairfax County residents. The Panel is independent from the Police Department and reports directly to the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors.

### PCR Timeline

- Mar. 3, 2015 - Ad Hoc Police Practices Commission created by Chairman Bulova to review Fairfax County Police Department's policies and practices
- Oct. 20, 2015 - Ad Hoc Police Practices Commission submitted its final report and recommendations to the Board of Supervisors, which included the establishment of a police auditor and a police civilian review panel
- Dec. 6, 2016 - Fairfax County Board of Supervisors voted to establish a Police Civilian Review Panel
- Feb. 28, 2017 - Board of Supervisors appointed nine members to the Police Civilian Review Panel
- Feb. 22, 2022 - The first Executive Director to the Police Civilian Review Panel was appointed

## What We Do

The Panel reviews police investigations involving serious police misconduct or abuses of authority. The Panel may also make recommendations regarding investigations of FCPD officer-involved shootings, in-custody deaths and use of force cases, which are reviewed by the Independent Police Auditor.

## How to File a Complaint

If you have experienced or observed misconduct by a Fairfax County police officer, you are encouraged to file a complaint. You will not be penalized by the police or any county official for filing a complaint.
