

# Fairfax County Annual CSR Snapshot – March 2021

This is the first annual report of Fairfax County's [Supply Chain Corporate Social Responsibility \(CSR\)](#) Program. Based on EcoVadis assessments of 67 major County suppliers from 39 industries representing over \$275 million in annual County spend, we now know:

## 1. Our suppliers outperform the global average on key sustainability topics:

## 2. Our supply chain has strengths and areas of improvement across many key performance indicators (more available upon request)

Environment	58%	of Fairfax County's suppliers take actions on energy consumption & greenhouse gases
	31%	use renewable energy
	45%	report on energy consumption or greenhouse gases *
	57%	have waste management measures in place (incl. reduction, reuse and recycling)
	9%	take measures to reduce water consumption *
Labor & Human Rights	37%	take actions to promote diversity
	46%	take actions to prevent discrimination and/or harassment
	73%	take actions to remediate discrimination and/or harassment
	42%	take actions in favor of disabled workers
	90%	take actions on working conditions that can be adapted for health crises *
Ethics	61%	take actions on employee health & safety that can be adapted for health crises *
	75%	have an active whistleblowing procedure in place
	67%	have a policy on corruption
