

- District Size: 56 sq. miles
- Coverage Area: Reston and parts of Great Falls, Vienna, Oak Hill, and Herndon zip codes
- Coverage over two managerial districts
- Reston contains four Police Service Areas (PSA):

 - 530




History

12000 Bowman Towne Drive 1984-2015 "Old Reston Station"

- Built in 1984, opening with about 60 officers to serve Reston.
- 16,000 sq.ft. with a secured flat lot of 78 spaces for patrol, specialty vehicles, and personal vehicles.
- By 2012 there became a need for an increased number of officers based on the area's population density, calls-for-service, crime and traffic related incidents. The number of Reston officers exceeded 100.

1801 Cameron Glen Drive 2015-Present

- Our newest, two-story building about 36,000 sq.ft.
- 168 parking spaces plus facilities for lockers and officer's equipment.
- It had been designed and integrated into the community so that the police public safety facility would have space to grow as the county's population and calls for service grow.





The ratio of RESTON DISTRICT OFFICERS to the number of housing units within the county...

- Averaged about 0.02554%
- Based on growth in Fairfax County the number of officers needed will approach 177 by the year 2032.
- Doubling the capacity of your officers will increase the need for a larger police facility footprint in Reston. Considerations include:
 - Expandability.
 - Interdepartmental access to resources.

Co-Responder Program

Co – Responder (COR) and Mental Health Calls For Service (COR As of March 2023)

Three Co – Responder Teams in Fairfax County Reston and Mclean do not have a Co-Responder Team assigned to their district. (staffing) COR 18 covers Sully (1) and Fair Oaks (8) stations COR 26 covers Mount Vernon (2) and Franconia (6) stations COR 47 covers Mason (4) and West Springfield (7) stations COR has been involved, directly or indirectly, in 33 cases in Reston since the pilot program started in 2021, starting with one COR Team in 2021, two COR teams in 2022, and now three COR teams as of May 2023, county wide.


