



FCPA Camps

Code of Conduct

Campers and guardians must review this required document together and sign below.

Campers must:

- Be able to participate in camp separate from Parent/Guardian. Parents/Guardians are not permitted to remain with campers during the camp day unless pre-approved through the Access and Inclusion support team.
- Maintain personal care (toileting, changing) without staff support.
- Keep hands to oneself and maintain self-control.
- *Always stay with assigned group.*
- *Respect others in what you say and do. Teasing and bullying are not permitted; children should report all incidents immediately to their counselor.*
- *Listen to program leaders and follow directions.*
- *Use appropriate language.*
- *Take care of their own belongings.*
- *Use equipment and supplies in a safe and appropriate manner.*
*** For the italicized behaviors above, campers with disabilities are required to follow these guidelines with Access and Inclusion support.
- Follow the policy for cell phones and other multimedia devices: Campers/CIT's may have cell phones and other multimedia devices, but they must be turned off and kept in the child's backpack during camp hours. We strongly suggest these items be left at home. FCPA will not be held responsible for lost or stolen items.

Parents/Guardians must:

- Complete and submit appropriate paperwork from the parent packet.
- Sign campers in and out of the program, bring photo I.D. and be on time.
- Contact the Camp Director or Program Manager immediately when issues arise.
- Adhere to the camp refund and transfer policy as outlined in the parent packet.
- Arrange for your camper to be picked up in the event of sickness, uncontrolled behavior, or other emergency needs.

Possible Grounds for Immediate Dismissal (no refund given):

Depending on the severity and other assessed factors, FCPA reserves the right to terminate part or all of a camper's enrollment in FCPA camps if:

- A camper who causes injury to another child or staff member.
- A camper who displays repeated inappropriate behaviors.
- A camper who fails to comply with the Code of Conduct.

Grounds for Immediate Dismissal (no refund given):

- A camper intentionally harms or threatens to harm himself or causes intentional injury (physical or verbal) to another child or staff member
- A parent or camper who refuses to follow FCPA policies as stated in the parent packet.
- A camper who brings a weapon to camp.
- A camper who vandalizes or steals the property of the camp facility, staff or other children.

Management of Behavior

Staff will manage disruptive and inappropriate behaviors by discussing with the camper what is appropriate behavior and redirecting behaviors when appropriate. If necessary, staff may remove a camper from an activity until they exhibit proper self-control. Staff will address problem behaviors with parents to strategize possible solutions. In situations where inappropriate or disruptive behavior persists, the camper's enrollment in FCPA programs may be terminated. Staff strive to meet the needs of the children by using proactive approaches and planning age/ability appropriate activities.

We have read and understand the rules of conduct and agree to uphold them to maintain a safe and enjoyable camp experience for everyone (**please bring this form with you on the first day of camp**).
