<u>Heroin & Prescription Drug Abuse Town Hall - Addressing a Public Health</u> Crisis in our Community and the Nation.

Heroin and prescription drug abuse is a very real problem in our community. In Virginia, more people die from heroin overdoses than car crashes each year. In Fairfax County, we all are receiving the numerous reports of overdoses, including four overdoses in one day earlier this year. Heroin is a public health crisis in our community and around the nation and Fairfax County is working to address it.



The problem is in your neighborhood - it is occurring across the county, not just in "bad" neighborhoods. Typically young adults - including many athletes. Education and public awareness are important parts of combating this growing crisis. **Seventy percent of heroin addicts reportedly start with prescription drugs.**

My Heroin and Prescription Drug Abuse Town Hall will be held on Tuesday, May 3 at 7:30 pm, in the Board Auditorium of the Fairfax County Government Center (12000 Government Center Parkway, Fairfax, VA). The town hall will raise awareness of the dangers of heroin and prescription drug abuse, discuss the steps being taken to address the crisis, and the practical steps that can be taken by our citizens and their families to reduce the growing epidemic.

There will be presentations by the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) on what they are seeing at the national level including warning signs, the Fairfax County Police Department (FCPD) on what we are seeing in our community and their response, Community Services Board (CSB) on how to get help, including their life saving REVIVE! Program, and Substance Abuse & Addiction Recovery Alliance's (SAARA) Nick Yacoub on the perspectives of a person in long term recovery from addiction, as well as brief updates from myself, the Unified Prevention Coalition of Fairfax County, Delegate Tim Hugo, and Congresswoman Barbara Comstock and a discussion period where the audience can ask questions.

Operation: Medicine Cabinet Cleanout

"Operation: Medicine Cabinet Cleanout" will be held on Saturday, April 30th from 8 am to 2 pm. Any person may drop off any unused or expired medications at any Fairfax County Police Station where the disposal is free, confidential, and safe.

Safe handling of unused or expired medication prevents accidental poisoning, protects the environment, and prevents prescription medications from falling into the wrong hands. Seventy percent of those that abuse prescription drugs obtain them from a relative or friend, typically without their knowledge.

Operation Medicine Cabinet Cleanout is sponsored by the Unified Prevention Coalition of Fairfax County in partnership with local businesses and in collaboration with the following Fairfax County government departments: Police, Health, Public and Private Partnerships, Neighborhood and Community Services, Public Works and Environmental Services, and the Fairfax-Falls Church Community Services Board.

<u>Project REVIVE! Opioid Overdose Reversal Training Program</u>

The Community Services Board has partnered with the Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services and the Chris Atwood Foundation to launch Project REVIVE! in our community. This program makes naloxone (Narcan®) available to lay rescuers to reverse opioid overdoses. Rolling Rd Weekend Lane Closures at Fairfax Co. Pkwy

The Virginia Department of Transportation will close both southbound turn lanes, one southbound through lane and two northbound lanes of Rolling Road at the Fairfax County Parkway interchange the nights of Friday, April 15 and Saturday, April 16 for bridge work, weather permitting.

The closures will occur from midnight Friday to 3 p.m. Saturday and from midnight Saturday to 3 p.m. Sunday, April 17. One lane in each direction will be open at all times.

The work is part of the \$14 million

North Loop at Fairfax County

Parkway/Rolling Road interchange

project, which is scheduled for completion in May 2016.
