

REVIVE! Training to Prevent Opioid Overdoses



REVIVE! is a program of the Commonwealth of Virginia that makes naloxone (Narcan®) available to lay rescuers to reverse opioid overdoses. 
All trainings below will take place at 3:00 p.m. at A New Beginning (4213 Walney Road, Chantilly, VA 20151) in the gym.

REVIVE! trains individuals on what to do and not do in an overdose situation, how to administer naloxone, and what to do afterwards. Each attendee also receives a free REVIVE! kit, which includes all the supplies needed to administer naloxone. The medication itself can be acquired at a pharmacy after completing the training. Attendees also receive a <u>safety plan</u> to help individuals prevent overdose if they relapse.

Following the training, CSB will dispense free naloxone to attendees who are residents of Fairfax County and Cities of Fairfax and Falls Church and who meet financial eligibility requirements. For more information, please contact <u>Lauren</u> <u>Nickum</u> (703-352-3431).

Volunteer Opportunity in Sully

Cub Run Stream Valley Park Volunteer Deputy Team Lead

The Cub Run Stream Valley Park Volunteer Team is a group of active local citizens with the intent to create a stronger, more resilient community focused around the vibrant Cub Run Stream Valley Park.

Duties:

The Cub Run Stream Valley Park Volunteer Deputy Team Lead will collaboratively plan, organize, advertise, and execute events for education, citizen science, biannual stream valley clean-ups, annual invasive plant removal, community workshops, cultural site maintenance, public quarterly meetings, quarterly nature hikes, stream monitoring, storm drain labeling, bird watching, and photography. This will be accomplished in partnership with the Fairfax County Park Authority, Northern Virginia Soil and Water District, and other local government agencies and civic groups where our mission and motto overlap. Volunteers will coordinate activity schedules and support needs with Cub Run RECenter volunteer staff and the park operations division. Invasive plant removal projects will be coordinated through the FCPA Invasive Management Area programs and proper training will be required for site leads. Effort will be spent using workshops and surveys to better understand community needs focused on this park. Frequent communication and networking with various stakeholders will create a faster feedback loop necessary for team learning. It is important to use a holistic approach with inclusion of both the physical and social sciences to ensure this team's viability. Internal PVT collaboration will be with other volunteers filling the PVT Lead, Cultural/Historic/Archeological Liaison, Trails Liaison, Community Liaison, Government Liaison, and Site Lead positions.

Qualifications:

Volunteers will complete a full profile in the volunteer management system where they will report hours monthly. Volunteers will take responsibility for completing safety trainings provided by the county as indicated by their volunteer opportunity.


Minimum Age to Volunteer: 18

According to our friends at the <u>American Heart Association</u>, most people who experience cardiac arrest at home, work or in a public location die because they don't receive immediate CPR from someone on the scene.

As a bystander, don't be afraid. Your actions can only help. Immediate CPR can double or even triple a person's chance of survival.

Making the Most of Summer



Summer days are just around the corner. While your child may be looking forward to more free time, you may be wondering just how to fill those days or worrying about fitting everything into those precious summer months. Here are some tips to help you make the most of the summer with your child and make sure they have time to recharge for next school year.

- Make sure your child has the supervision needed to stay safe and healthy. Adequate supervision is essential to ensure the safety and wellbeing of children. The Fairfax County Department of Family Services has published <u>guidelines to help you determine if your child is ready to be</u> <u>left unsupervised</u>.
- 2. **Make family time a priority**. You don't have to go on a family vacation to make family time a priority this summer. Try to set aside time each day to do something as a family.
- Avoid the summer slide. Children can lose academic gains in the summer.
 One way to address this is to encourage your child to read during the

summer months. The <u>Fairfax County Public Libraries</u> will once again host their <u>Summer Reading Adventure program</u> for children from birth to rising seniors. The program runs from June 15 to September 1.

- 4. **Find meaningful summer enrichment opportunities.** Summer is a great time for high school students to take advantage of enrichment opportunities that will allow them to explore different careers and prepare for life after high school.
- 5. Weigh the benefits and drawbacks of optional academic summer courses. While some students may be required to attend summer academic programs, other students may have the option of taking a high school course in the summer. It is important to talk with your child about the reason for taking a summer course before enrolling.
- 6. **Give your child time to relax while maintaining some structure.** It can be tempting to fill your summer with events and activities, but be sure to build in some downtime for everyone in your home.
