

# Gary Scott Appointed Fairfax County's General Registrar



The Fairfax County <u>Electoral Board</u> recently appointed Gary Scott as general registrar and director of elections. Fairfax County is the largest jurisdiction in Virginia with more than 700,000 registered voters and 243 voter precincts. <u>Role of general registrar in Virginia elections</u>.

Scott has worked for the county's <u>Office of Elections</u> for 22 years. He had been the deputy registrar for the county since 1997, with responsibilities including managing voter registration, absentee voting and outreach programs. Prior to becoming deputy registrar, he was the office manager for the county's Office of the General Registrar.

Scott served as an officer in the U.S. Navy from 1975 to 1994 and graduated cum laude from Texas Tech University in 1975.



The long-term stream monitoring program meets the requirements of state and federal regulations and supports the Board of Supervisors' environmental improvement program.

## Virginia Medicaid Expansion



Beginning in **January 2019**, approximately 28,000 uninsured individuals in Fairfax County may be eligible for medical coverage:

- Adults ages 19-64
- Not Medicare eligible
- Income from up to 138% of the federal poverty line
- Single Adult earning up to \$16,753
- Parent in family of four earning up to \$34,638

Medicaid expansion will have a positive impact on the families and communities we serve by increasing access to comprehensive health care and improving health outcomes.
