- Dogs <u>MUST</u> be on leashes. Cats and ferrets <u>MUST</u> be in carriers.
- All pets will receive a 1 year rabies vaccination. To obtain a 3 year vaccine, you <u>MUST</u> bring your pet's
 rabies certificate showing the current rabies vaccination expiration date. (Tags are not acceptable
 proof)
- Only rabies certificates may be issued (no tags).
- Cash and check only.
- · 2018 County Dog Licenses will be sold for an additional cost of \$10.



The reduced cost vables clinics are hosted by the Fairfax County Animal Shelter and Pender Veterinary Clinic. Partnerships with the Offices of Supervisor Penelope A. Gross, Supervisor Pat Herrity, Supervisor Cathy Hudgins, Supervisor Kathy Smith, Supervisor Daniel G. Storck, and The Fairfax County Park Authority allow the clinics to be taken to locations around the County.








Sully Land Use Spotlight



Recent Cases:

SEA 97-Y-050 (Arlington County Chapter Inc., of Izaak Walton League of America) -

The applicant is requesting approval to amend the Special Exception (SE 97-Y-050), which currently governs the property as a Private Club and Benefit Association, to permit modifications to site layout, development conditions, and to include additional land area. The applicant proposes to continue their mission and operate the following uses on the site: Target Archery Range; Air Rifle Range; Rifle & Pistol Range; Skeet & Trap Range; Field Archery Course; Picnic Areas; Camping Areas; and a recreational Pond. These uses were permitted with the original Special Exception application. The applicant is proposing a phased development to construct additional parking spaces, minor building additions and provide for a future 31,000-square foot educational and training facility on the subject property. The applicant is also requesting permission for unlimited membership to allow for additional funding needed to continue their mission. Staff recommends approval. RZ 2018-SU-008/PCA 2009-SU-020-03 (K. Hovnanian Homes at Pender Oaks, LLC) -

This property is located North of Lee Jackson Memorial Highway approximately 315 feet Northwest of Fair Ridge Drive. The applicant proposes to delete 18.07 acres of land from RZ 2009-SU-020 to permit it to be rezoned to the PDH-12 District. To view the staff report, click here.

PA 2018-III-BR1 -

Plan Amendment 2018-III-BR1 proposes to amend the Comprehensive Plan guidance for Tax Map Parcels 44-3 ((7)) B2 and B3, an approximately 17.43 acre area located adjacent to the southern boundary of Land Unit J of the Dulles Suburban Center. The subject area's Comprehensive Plan recommendation is for retail use at an intensity up to .25 FAR. The amendment considers an extension to the boundary of the Dulles Suburban Center to create a new land unit that includes the Sully Station Shopping Center. The Plan Amendment does not consider any other changes to the Comprehensive Plan. To view the staff report, click here.

Volunteer Opportunity



Election Officers

Election Day, November 6, is coming up soon and the Office of Elections needs election officers to assist our voters. The Office of Elections especially encourage bilingual citizens to serve as they need language assistance in many precincts.

Duties: The Election Officer's main priority is to ensure the accuracy and integrity of the election process. A typical Election Day consists of arriving one hour before polls open to set up voting equipment, hanging up pertinent signage, preparing the polling room for voting, processing voters throughout the day, assisting with operating voting equipment, securing voting equipment, and closing down the polling place at the end of the day.

Volunteer Benefits: Election Officers are offered a stipend of \$175 for serving a full day.

Qualification: In order to be an Election Officer, you must be: fluent in English, a

registered voter in the Commonwealth of Virginia, be able to fulfill the Federal I-9 employment eligibility requirements, attend a 3 hour training class, arrive at the polling place at 5:00 a.m. and remain until all work has been completed after the polls close at 7:00 p.m., and have basic computer skills. Minimum age to volunteer is 17.





lived with another dog and a cat in the past, tolerates well mannered children, and likes a healthy mix of chilling inside and exploring the outdoors with his people. He loves "chatting" with his people and telling you all about his day. And he is housebroken. What's not to love?

He recently spent some time with one of the shelter's fosters, and this is what she had to say: "Thunder - where do I even start?! The family that adopts him with be SO lucky! He is a perfect gentleman who greets any and everyone with a tail that goes in circle like a pinwheel - it is the cutest thing ever. He loves to be with his people inside/outside and doesn't mind taking a nap next to you on the couch or sleeping in your room (even your bed if you'll let him). He was amazing with all the children he met and my kids adored him.
