Turkey Walk


Date: Saturday, November 24, 2018



Transportation Board. The meeting will begin with an open house followed by a public comment period. At the open house you can learn about various transportation initiatives, as well as Virginia's project prioritization process (SMART SCALE), Virginia's Statewide Transportation Improvement Program, and the VTrans Multimodal Transportation Plan. Representatives from the Office of Intermodal Planning and Investment and Departments of Transportation and Rail and Public Transportation will be in attendance to highlight their transportation programs and discuss you ideas and concerns about Virginia's transportation network. Comments will be accepted at the meeting and may also be submitted via email or online at www.CTB.Virginia.gov. Comments will be accepted until December 13, 2018.

Are You Eligible for Medicaid? You Might Be Now

Who Qualifies for Virginia Medicaid?



Good news! The Commonwealth of Virginia has expanded the list of those who are eligible for Medicaid and applications are now being accepted for coverage, which will go into effect January 1, 2019. Even if you were not previously eligible for Medicaid, you may now be able to enroll if you meet the revised program requirements.

Find Out if You Are Eligible:

Adults without children are now eligible for Medicaid and income caps have been expanded for families and people with disabilities. As of November 1, 2018, the following are now eligible and encouraged to apply for Medicaid:

Adults ages 19-64

- Not Medicare eligible
- Income from up to 138 percent of the federal poverty line
- Single Adult earning up to \$16,753
- Parent in family of four earning up to \$34,638

Adjusting to New Recycling Realities; 5 Ways You Can Help Stop "Wishful Recycling"



What happens to your recycled items these days?

That's a good question as the worldwide recycling market has changed dramatically in recent months, especially due to "Operation National Sword" in China.

Here in Fairfax County, the local third-party recycling processor says nearly 30 percent of material received is actually trash. To do our part in this worldwide process, we need everyone to focus on reducing the amount of contaminated materials placed in recycling bins.

5 Ways to Adjust Your Recycling Habits:

- 1. Only place empty, clean, dry, loose items in your bin
- 2. Dump the Filthy Five! These five items should never be placed in your recycling bin:
 - 1. Plastic bags
 - 2. Shredded paper
 - 3. Tanglers (hoses/hangers/cords)
 - 4. Styrofoam containers
 - 5. Dirty diapers
- 3. Purchase products made with high recycled content
- 4. When in doubt, throw it out
- Make an effort to reduce the amount of waste you create reuse what you can

Snow Day Camps Return Providing Options in Bad Weather



The <u>Fairfax County Park Authority</u> (FCPA) will once again offer Snow Day Camps at a limited number of RECenters. The camps offer an alternative for working parents in need of childcare on snowy days. Snow Day Camps for school-aged children will operate at <u>Audrey Moore</u>, <u>Lee District</u>, <u>Spring Hill</u>, and <u>Oak Marr</u> RECenters when schools are closed for multiple days.

Snow Day Camps will be held when Fairfax County Public Schools are closed for students two or more days in a row between November 1, 2018 and March 31, 2019 due to inclement weather. These dates exclude holiday breaks. Camps do not operate on weekends and will not be held should the Fairfax County Government or the Fairfax County Park Authority close.

Snow Day camps operate from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. for children ages five to ten. Parents must provide lunch.

Spaces at the camps are limited and are allotted on a first come, first serve basis. You may also register by phone from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at 703-222-4664 or at any participating RECenter.
