Only registered voters in the 86th District may vote in this special election. The three precincts in the 86th District in Sully are: Oak Hill (909), Armfield (927), and Carson (931). The deadline to register to vote in this special election is Tuesday, February 12, 2019 at 5:00 p.m.

In-person absentee voting will be available at the Fairfax County Government Center from now until 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, February 16, 2019. The Herndon Fortnightly Library will be open for in-person absentee voting on Saturday, February 16 only from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. These are the only two locations for in-person absentee for the special election. On the day of the special election you will vote at your regular polling place. More information is below.

Special Election on February 19 for 86th Virginia House District

A [special election](#) will be held on Tuesday, February 19, 2019, for the 86th District of the Virginia House of Delegates (pictured below). Only registered voters in the [86th District](#) may vote.

The election is to fill the unexpired term of former Del. Jennifer Boysko who was elected to the 33rd District of the Virginia Senate on January 8, 2019. The term for this house seat will expire on January 8, 2020.

The 86th District covers portions of both Loudoun and western Fairfax counties. **The three precincts in the 86th District in Sully are: Oak Hill (909), Armfield (927), and Carson (931).**

Voter Registration:

If you are not currently registered to vote, **the deadline to register in person for this special election is February 12, 2019 at 5:00 p.m.** Applications submitted by mail must be postmarked February 12, 2019 or earlier. Electronic registrations may be submitted by February 12, 2019 until 11:59 p.m.

Absentee Voting:

In-person absentee voting will begin on Wednesday, January 30, 2019, and will end on Saturday, February 16, 2019 at 5:00 p.m. The state permits [20 valid](#)





New Survey Effort Takes a Closer Look at Aging in Fairfax County



In February, thousands of adults, 50 and over, will find yellow post cards in their mailboxes inviting them to participate in Fairfax County's first 50+ Community Survey for Fairfax County and the Cities of Fairfax and Falls Church. Survey

recipients will be randomly selected.

The survey is part of a county-wide initiative to create a more aging-friendly community. The local governments conducting the survey hope to learn more about the lifestyles of individuals among the 50+ community including opportunities to work, socialize and volunteer; issues facing these adults such as retirement, housing, and caregiving; and their usage of community services like public transportation and Senior Centers.

The county has contracted with the [National Research Center](#) to conduct the survey. All responses are anonymous.

While not everyone will receive a survey, everyone is encouraged to make their voice heard. Public Hearing on E-Bike Use on Park Trails

A public hearing will be held on proposed changes to regulations on the use of Electrically Assisted Bicycles, or e-bikes, in Fairfax County and NOVA Parks.

The hearing will cover proposed changes to Park Authority Regulations §1.14 Motor Vehicles and Traffic. Under the proposal, the regulation would define an e-bike and clarify distinctions between e-bikes and mopeds. E-bikes would be allowed anywhere traditional pedal-powered bikes are allowed. Mopeds would be allowed only where motor vehicles are permitted. For more information, click [here](#).

Library Releases Report on Return Investment



In FY 2017 the library's 23 branches, including [Access Services](#) and the [Virginia Room](#), provided \$244.5 million in resources and services to county residents, including educational programs and materials, events, digital media, and research databases.

For every one dollar invested in the Fairfax County Public Library (FCPL), the community receives \$6.51 in the form of access to resources, programming, services, and technology. This figure is calculated by dividing the total value of

library resources and services delivered (\$244.6 million) by the FCPL FY 2017 full budget of \$37.6 million.

FCPL circulates more than 10 million physical items and more than 1.5 million electronic items each year with the latter number continually growing.

According to data collected for FY 2017, 3.45 million adult books were borrowed at a value of \$58.76 million; 395,078 young adult books borrowed (\$4.74 million value); 5.53 million children's books borrowed (\$94.02 million value); 1.52 million eBooks and eAudiobooks downloaded (\$22.92 million value); 197,539 audiobooks borrowed (\$2.56 million value); and 5,938 Interlibrary Loan items borrowed (\$148,450 value).

reaches the Chesapeake Bay and helps prevent flooding.
