
Dozens of Trash Bags Filled During Watershed Clean-up Events

Fairfax County parks are looking a lot cleaner thanks to the efforts of hundreds of staff and volunteers who turned out for Watershed Clean-up Day events on Saturday, April 6, 2019.

More than 900 volunteers at 15 Park Authority sites removed an estimated 6.8 tons of trash. Volunteers donated 2,016 hours of service to the effort along more than 45 miles of stream, shoreline, roadways, and trails. Plastic bottles, cans, and grocery bags were among the items most frequently found. Some of the more unusual items dragged from the parks include: an uncashed check for \$50, a folder of dog x-rays, a couch, a drone, auto parts, a suitcase, lawn furniture, and a fire extinguisher.
