# Deadline Extended Until June 3 for Fairfax County & Franconia-Springfield Parkways Survey:

The Fairfax County Department of Transportation (FCDOT) has posted <u>Frequently Asked Questions</u> about the <u>Fairfax County & Franconia-Springfield Parkways</u>

<u>Alternative Analysis and Long Term Planning Study</u>, and has extended the deadline for the <u>online survey</u> for two weeks. **The online survey will close on June 3, 2019, at 11:59 p.m.** 

The survey was developed based on community input from first round survey results last year. The current survey will gather feedback from residents on future corridor transportation improvements and help the project team decide which improvements will be selected for screening and testing.

# Fairfax Connector Service Changes for Celebrate Fairfax



Due to the annual Celebrate Fairfax! festival, the <u>Fairfax County Government</u> <u>Center Park and Ride</u> facility and <u>Route 699</u> express service to downtown D.C. will be temporarily relocated June 3-4, 2019, and the bus stops at the Government Center serving Fairfax Connector routes 605, 621, and 623 will be temporarily closed June 4-9, 2019.

#### Relocation of Government Center Park and Ride and Route 699 Service:

Route 699 and the Government Center Park & Ride will be temporarily relocated to Fair Oaks Mall (<u>View map of new location</u>).

#### Routes 605, 621, 623 Not Serving the Government Center Stops:

Fairfax Connector Routes <u>605</u>, <u>621</u>, and <u>623</u> will not serve the Government Center. Buses will bypass stops at the Government Center main building and parkand-ride. Passengers should board and exit buses at stops along Government Center Parkway, west of Forum Drive, or along Post Forest Drive between Government Center Parkway and Legato Road.

- Residential material of a sensitive nature, such as tax documents, financial records, etc....
- Up to four medium-sized packing boxes per vehicle.

# VDOT Route 29 Widening Fairfax County Design Public Hearing



Date: Monday, June 10, 2019

**Time:** 6:30 to 8:30 p.m.

Location: VDOT Northern Virginia District Building, Potomac Conference Room

Find out about plans to widen 1.5 miles of Route 29 (Lee Highway) from four to six lanes between Union Mill Road and Buckleys Gate Drive to relieve congestion and improve operations and safety. To view information about the project, <u>click here</u>.

The project will also correct vertical alignment to improve sight distance, add/improve bicycle and pedestrian shared-use paths on both sides of Route 29, and provide connectivity to bicycle/pedestrian trials at the Fairfax County Parkway/West Ox Road interchange.

Stop by between 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. to view displays and learn more about the project, its preliminary design and the environmental studies. A presentation will begin at 7:00 p.m. Project staff will be available to answer your questions.

As the Fairfax County Police Department continues to develop innovative policies and strategies to provide our community with the highest quality of police service, they are grateful for the ongoing support of our residents. As you can see in the 2018 Annual Report, the Police Department takes pride in their community partnerships as well as keeping Fairfax County a safe place to live, work, play, and grow old.

#### Highlights from 2018:

- According to the Major Cities Chiefs Association Crime Survey, the county's homicide, sexual assault, and aggravated assault crimes have declined compared to 2017
- 20 Crime Scene Section detectives handled over 1,200 cases last year
- 26 Animal Protection Police Officers handled over 13,000 calls for service and helped more than 3,800 sick or injured animals
- 150 volunteers provided over 30,000 hours of service to the community
- Continued partnerships through the Communities of Trust Committee, the Chief's Council on Diversity Recruitment, Citizens Advisory Committee, and the Special Olympics
