Transform I-66 Outside the Beltway Project Update



Construction activities for a new park access road at the Fairfax County Park Authority's (FCPA) Ellanor C. Lawrence Park began on Monday, June 18, 2018. The new road is needed to provide access to the park when the existing traffic signal and entrance from Route 28 are eliminated. As part of the park access, and in conjunction with the project, roadwork will also include a new Poplar Tree Road across Route 28 connecting to the new park access and to Stonecroft Boulevard; that is expected to get underway later this year. This work is part of the Virginia Department of Transportation's (VDOT) Transform 66 Outside the Beltway Project. You can find information regarding this project online at <u>Transform 66</u>.

FCPA has been working closely with VDOT and its Design-Build Contractor, Ferrovial Agroman US Corp, Allan Myers VA, Inc. (FAM Construction). Tree clearing will be visible on the west side of Route 28 and from the existing parking lot north toward Stonecroft Boulevard. Actual construction of the access road is not scheduled to begin until later this year. There are no scheduled impacts to the existing entrance from Route 28, the ball fields, or parking lots during this phase.

Public Workshop on Airport Aircraft Noise Contour Map Update



The Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority (MWAA) will hold two public workshops regarding the <u>Washington Dulles International Airport Aircraft noise</u> <u>contour map update</u>. These workshops will provide an overview of the study, including airfield plans, existing airport operations and basic information regarding aircraft noise and noise modeling standards.



A noise contour map update for Dulles International will help guide local land use planning in the immediate geographic vicinity of the airport. The maps are an update to contours prepared in 1993 that serve as the basis for the Loudoun and Fairfax counties' Airport Impact Overlay Districts zoning. This helps ensure compatible land uses surrounding the airport. Public workshops include an opportunity to visit with subject matter experts involved in the effort.

Individuals are welcome to <u>submit</u> questions and comments during these workshops, or at any time online until the conclusion of this process in early 2019.

Planning Commission will hold a public hearing on PCA 91-Y-006/SE 2018-SU-001 (Trustees of Pender United Methodist Church). The proffer condition amendment (PCA) would enable building additions to the existing church facility and the construction of a pavilion thereby increasing the on-site Floor Area Ratio (FAR) from .21 to .25 (the maximum permitted level in an R-3 Zoning District). The special exception (SE) application would continue the existing religious facility and child care center uses, while allowing a slight increase in child care center enrollment from 75 children (as approved through special permits approved by the Board of Zoning Appeals) to 99 children. NVTA Funds Nine Transportation Projects in Fairfax County



Fairfax County congratulates the <u>Northern Virginia Transportation Authority</u> (NVTA) on the adoption of its first six-year transportation program which is designed to provide congestion relief throughout the region. This milestone is a result of collaboration and coordination of Northern Virginia jurisdictions, transportation agencies, partners, and Northern Virginians, who participated in the selection of projects that will improve the quality of life in the region.

With a total of 44 regionally significant, multimodal transportation projects, the program includes funding for nine projects within Fairfax County. This accounts for \$531 million or 41.32 percent of the \$1.285 billion program.

Through three previously adopted funding programs, the Authority has funded 78 transportation projects, valued at more than \$690 million, including many throughout Fairfax County.

To earn prizes, you must read a certain number of books depending on your age:


- Birth-Grade 3: read 15 books
