A Message from Kathy Smith

This past Wednesday, August 26, was Women's Equality Day which marked the 100th anniversary of the ratification of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, giving women the right to vote.

While we commemorate this day it is important to remember that the 19th Amendment did not guarantee voting rights for all women. Native Americans did not gain the right to vote until 1924, for Asian/Pacific Islander Americans it was 1952, African Americans and Latin Americans suffered from voter suppression until the passage of the Voting Rights Act of 1965 and 1975, and voter suppression still targets marginalized communities to this day.

We continue the fight for equality today, most recently by ratifying the Equal Rights Amendment on January 27, 2020. Virginia was the 38th and final state to ratify the ERA, which meets the threshold required to make it a new amendment to the Constitution. Additionally, the Lucy Burns Museum opened this year at the Workhouse Arts Center in Lorton. The museum showcases the history of the prison and the story of the suffragists that were imprisoned there in 1917.

The U.S. Faces a Critical Blood Shortage. Donate Now!:

Real Estate Taxes are Due Today, August 28, 2020:

- The first installment of 2020 real estate taxes is due today, Friday, August, 28, 2020.
- <u>Pay online</u> E-checks are a free, quick and easy way to pay. <u>Other payment options are available</u>, but they may involve service fees.
- Bills were mailed to homeowners in July, and you will need this year's stub number from your real estate tax bill to pay online.
- The Aug. 28 due date applies to homeowners who pay their real estate taxes directly to the county. However, many homeowners pay their real estate taxes as part of a monthly mortgage payment. The mortgage company then sends the taxes directly to Fairfax County. Contact your mortgage company if you have questions.

VDOT - Installation of I-66 Bridge Beams Over Rt. 29 in Centreville Continues This Weekend, Aug. 28-31; Rt. 29 Reduced to Two Lanes Under I-66:

 Installation of bridge beams for the new I-66 bridges over Rt. 29 in Centreville continues this weekend and will require reducing Rt. 29 under I-66 to a single travel lane in each direction starting at 9 p.m. Friday, August 28, continuing through 5 a.m. Monday, August 31. Details

<u>VDOT - Extended Single-Lane Closure on Bull Run Drive Over I-66 in Centreville for Bridge Inspection and Repair Work:</u>

 Bull Run Drive northbound and southbound traffic will be flagged with alternating travel in a single lane over I-66 until a temporary traffic signal is put in place to direct traffic. This temporary traffic pattern will remain in place until necessary repairs are completed. <u>Details</u>
