





## Managing Trees in Preservation Areas

If you own property that is near a stream, it may be part of a network of preservation areas known as Chesapeake Bay Resource Protection Areas or RPAs. RPAs have been established around coastal areas and tributaries in Virginia to protect water quality in the Chesapeake Bay.

What does this mean for property owners? You may be restricted from land disturbance activities including tree or shrub removal or adding new landscaping. Situations do arise where vegetation needs to be removed from a protected RPA, usually when a tree becomes a hazard to private property or the general public. When this is the case, the property owner must request a waiver from the Department of Land Development Services (LDS) and fill out a [vegetation removal application](#) prior to any disturbance.

## The Green Column



### Proper Discharge of Swimming Pool Water

Swimming pool owners and operators can help protect local streams and rivers by following [these guidelines](#) for draining (discharging) swimming pool water.

The Stormwater Management Ordinance, prohibits the discharge of substances other than naturally occurring surface or subsurface waters to Fairfax County's storm drainage system and waters of the state unless it is authorized by a state permit. Dechlorinated pool water is authorized by the state. Violating the Stormwater Management Ordinance may result in a civil penalty.

Chlorine, bromine, salt and other pool chemicals that are used to keep swimming pools safe for people may kill fish and other aquatic life in streams. Stagnant pool water may kill aquatic life if it contains too little oxygen when it flows into a stream.

Draining water from swimming pools too quickly can cause erosion of the stream bed and banks, especially in smaller streams. Erosion can damage habitat and water quality. Recommended draining rates are 12-15 gallons per minute with a maximum rate of 25 gallons per minute to storm drains or streams.
