

# **Sully District 2018 Paving & Restriping Meeting**



The Virginia Department of Transportation and Fairfax County Department of Transportation will host a community information meeting to discuss this year's paving and restriping efforts in the Sully District on Wednesday, January 31, 7:00 to 8:30 p.m., in the Richard Frank Community Room of the Sully Governmental Center (4900 Stonecroft Boulevard, Chantilly, VA 20151). The meeting provides residents with an opportunity to speak directly with road engineers and transportation planners about the repaving program, proposed striping changes and general traffic safety concerns. Information about repaving and restriping in the Sully District will be on display in an open house format, with a

presentation at 7:30 p.m.

Community members are invited to give feedback on general traffic safety concerns regarding roads scheduled for repaving, as well as the proposed striping changes, at the meeting or via the <u>Sully District</u> page through Saturday, February 17, 2018.

# FAIRFAX COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE MODERNIZATION PROJECT

### BACKGROUND

Fairfax County is undertaking a major initiative to modernize its Zoning Ordinance, which was adopted in its current form 40 years ago. The county has hired Clarion Associates, a national land use consulting firm, to assist with this important project. The effort will include a reformatting of the structure of the ordinance and a recategorization of land uses to make them more reflective of current terminologies and use characteristics.



SP 2017-SU-092: This is a special permit case in the Sully District to permit
modification to the limitations on the keeping of animals (dogs). Specifically,
it would allow for the keeping of seven existing dogs at the subject property.
County staff has recommended approval of a limited term special permit
based on the applicant's indication of an anticipated re-location within the
approximate one-year period covered by the proposed special permit.

## **Planning Commission Meetings -**

• RZ 2017-SU-025/SE 2017-SU-022: This combined special exception and re-zoning case would enable the construction of a mini-warehousing establishment at the end of the Fort Drive cul-de-sac in Centreville. It is just southwest of the intersection of Sully Road and Lee Hwy. The re-zoning would shift the subject property from a C-7 Commercial District to a C-8 Commercial District and the special exception would a) allow the proposed facility and b) increase the FAR level from .50 to .70. This is scheduled as a decision-only hearing as a follow-up to the initial public hearing.

# FCPS Budget for Fiscal Year 2019



Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) Superintendent Scott S. Brabrand presented a \$2.9 billion Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 Proposed Budget, with a focus on employee compensation, to the Fairfax County School Board at its business meeting on January 11. The FY 2019 Proposed Budget represents an increase of \$118.7 million, or 4.3 percent, over the FY 2018 Approved Budget.

"Our focus remains on achieving success for each of the more than 189,000 students in Fairfax County Public Schools," said Brabrand. "This is why 86 percent of our budget is allocated towards instruction and my number one priority for this budget is ensuring we have the best possible teacher in every classroom.

"This budget continues to support our multi-year effort to improve compensation for teachers," said Brabrand. "By dedicating an additional \$53.1 million to accelerate the enhancement of our teacher salary scales and align salaries more closely to the market average, we can take another step toward making FCPS competitive in the teacher job market. Great teachers are a hallmark of this school district, and we need to ensure that they will remain a part of the FCPS family."

The proposed budget includes \$43.9 million for a step increase for eligible employees, and \$17.9 million for the implementation of nonteacher scales (school-based administrators, clerical, custodians, psychologists, social workers, and central office personnel), to better align FCPS support pay with the market. The FY 2019 budget also includes \$13.4 million for anticipated increases in health insurance.

The FY 2019 budget also includes \$15.8 million for enrollment growth and changes in student demographics.

The presentation of the FY 2019 Proposed Budget is the starting point of the budget process, which ends in May with the School Board's adoption of the Approved Budget. FCPS FY 2019 begins July 1, 2018.


The Fairfax County School Board will hold a work session on Monday, January 22, and public hearings on the FY 2019 budget on Monday, January 29 (and January 30 and 31, if needed). An additional budget work session is scheduled for Thursday, February 1.

The School Board will adopt its Advertised Budget on February 8 and present to the Board of Supervisors on Tuesday, April 10.

# 2018 Dog License & Renewal Due January 31



Your lovable canine needs to have a license (or a renewed license).

An estimated 87,000 licensed dogs live in our county and the **deadline to renew licenses is Wednesday, January 31**. The dog license fee is \$10 per dog and is good for one year (excluding service dogs, which receive licenses free of charge).

After we receive your information and fee, you will be mailed a license tag for your dog's collar.

All dogs **four months old and up** must be licensed. Here's what you need to do by the deadline, including if your dog passed away this year.

## **Renewing A Dog License:**

If you are renewing your dog license, you should have received a **renewal notice** in the mail in November from the Department of Tax Administration.

On that notice is your registration number and previous license number. You will need that information to renew your license and pay online. If you do not have that information handy, please contact the Department of Tax Administration at 703-222-8234 (TTY 711), or by email at <a href="mailto:dtadog@fairfaxcounty.gov.">dtadog@fairfaxcounty.gov.</a>

## Renew Dog License

Please note: There is a **service fee of 65 cents**, which is a charge imposed by the county's e-commerce vendor, for processing all electronic dog tag transactions, including e-checks.

## Here is what you need to do to get a license if you are a new dog owner:

- By Mail: Send a completed copy of the <u>Dog License Application</u>, a check for \$10 payable to the County of Fairfax, and a current certificate of rabies vaccination to the County of Fairfax, Department of Tax Administration, 12000 Government Center Parkway, Suite 223, Fairfax, VA 22035.
- In Person: Bring a completed copy of the <u>Dog License Application</u>, a check for \$10 payable to the County of Fairfax, and a current certificate of rabies vaccination, to one of the following locations:

 The <u>Department of Tax Administration</u> at 12000 Government Center Parkway, Suite 223, Fairfax, VA 22035 weekdays, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., or Thursdays until 6:30 p.m.

 The <u>Animal Shelter</u> at 4500 West Ox Road, Fairfax, VA Tuesday through Friday, 12:00 to 7:00 p.m., or Saturday, 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

# No Longer Own a Dog?:

Please let us know if you no longer own your licensed dog, if it passed away, or is living outside the county. You will need your registration number and previous license number that was sent to you in November. If you do not have that information, please contact the Department of Tax Administration at 703-222-8234 (TTY: 711), or by email at <a href="mailto:dtadog@fairfaxcounty.gov">dtadog@fairfaxcounty.gov</a>.

# **Student Bus Pass Program**



Students: Get where you need to go - FAST and FREE!

Did you know that you can now sign-up for the Free Student Bus Pass Program at all Fairfax County High Schools and Middle Schools and ride the Fairfax Connector and City of Fairfax CUE bus for free? You can check for more information at your school's administration office; you need to have your parent's/guardian's approval for signing up.

## 3 Things to Remember - Applying for Your Free Pass:

- The free student bus pass permits students to ride Fairfax Connector or
   City of Fairfax CUE buses for free from 5:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., 7 days
   a week. All other times you will need cash or a SmarTrip® card.
- Students must contact their school's administration office to get the appropriate forms to sign up.
- Parental/guardian consent is required for this program (this is a requirement of FCPS; Fairfax County Government does not distribute consent forms.)

# Tips for Riding Fairfax Connector and City of Fairfax CUE:

- Have your student pass out and ready to show the driver when you board the bus.
- Your Free Student Pass will work on Fairfax Connector and City of Fairfax CUE buses. If you switch to Metro or any other bus system you will need cash or a SmarTrip® card.
- Your pass works from 5:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., 7 days a week. Other times you will need cash or a SmarTrip® card.
- Another important thing to remember is to give respect to get respect. It's
  important to be kind to other riders, especially those with special needs.
   There are seats designed just for them so try to avoid sitting there.
- If you get lost or turned around, the Fairfax Connector drivers are great! Just tell them you need help and they will help you.

# **Winter Pet Tips**



### **Protect Those Paws!**

Salt and other chemicals can cause real damage to paws. Use booties if your dog will tolerate them, apply a thin coat of vaseline or a product specifically designed to protect pads. And clean those paws when you get in.

## Rap on the Hood

Or honk your horn. Some cats will curl up on an engine or in a wheel well to stay warm. Make some noise before you start your car and give them a chance to clear out.





### Focus While on Walks

Pick a route that avoids hazards like frozen ponds or streams where a few wrong steps can create a dangerous situation. Wear shoes with good traction, watch out for ice and don't use a retractable leash.

#### Make a Storm Kit

A major winter storm may keep you off the road or without power for a few days. Make a storm kit with five days worth of food, water and medication for all of your pets.





### Stay Alert

Signs of hypothermia in pets include shivering, whining, sluggish or anxious behavior. Take shorter walks in cold weather, use a coat or sweater if your dog is short-haired, small or older and don't leave your pet outside.



Tethering a dog for more than one cumulative hour during any 24-hour period, unless the dog is under the direct supervision and control of its owner or custodian, is prohibited in Fairfax County. If you see an animal at risk call Animal Protection Police Dispatch, 703-691-2131.
