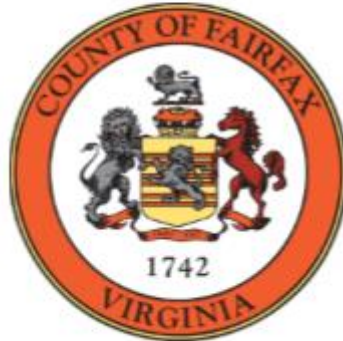

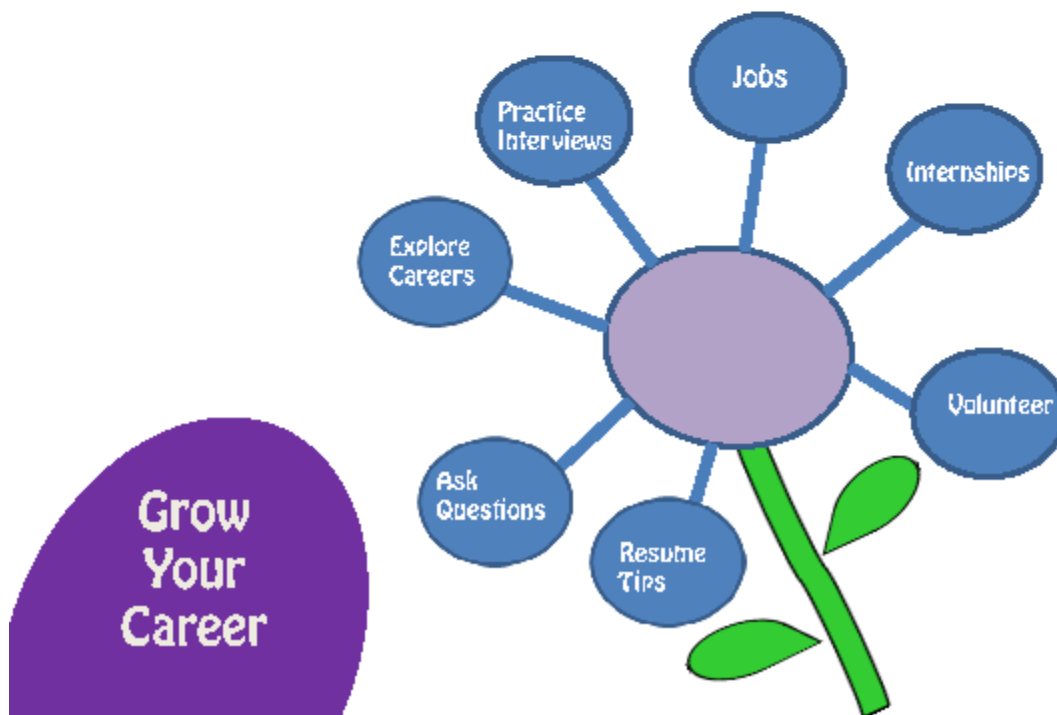

Braddock/Pleasant Valley Lane Closures Next Week

Nighttime closures for paving include total stoppages of 30 minutes each

Drivers can expect nighttime lane closures, including total stoppages each lasting up to 30 minutes, at the intersection of Braddock and Pleasant Valley roads April 17 through Saturday night, April 23 for final paving associated with the roundabout project, according to the Virginia Department of Transportation.

The Monday through Thursday night closures will occur from 9:30 until 5 the following morning. Friday night's closures begin at 10 and will last until 8 a.m. Saturday, April 23. All work is weather permitting.

Motorists are advised to use alternate routes.

This [project](#) replaces the existing four-way stop with a one-lane roundabout in western Fairfax, to improve operations and enhance safety. The \$5.8 million project is being administered in partnership with Fairfax County and is expected to be complete in May 2016.
