To avoid a 10 percent penalty, the deadline to renew BPOL licenses is Monday, March 2, 2020. ### 2020 CALEA Assessment Public Hearing



The Fairfax County Police Department is scheduled for a site-based assessment as part of a program to achieve re-accreditation by verifying it meets professional standards.

Administered by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. (CALEA), the accreditation program requires agencies to comply with state-of-the-art standards in four basic areas: policy and procedures, administration, operations, and support services.

As part of the assessment, agency employees and members of the community are invited to offer comments at a public information session on February 25, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. The session will be held in Room 7 of the Fairfax County Government Center (12000 Government Center Parkway, Fairfax, VA 22035).


### **Mealtime Companion**

#### PCA 2016-SU-015 (Old Lee Road LLC) -

Located on approximately 5.35 acres zoned I-5, AN, and WS in the Sully District. The applicant, Old Lee Road LLC, seeks approval of a Proffered Condition Amendment (PCA) to amend the proffers and to permit site modifications. Fairfax County staff recommends approval of PCA 2016-SU-015, subject to the execution of proffers consistent with those contained in Appendix 1 of the <u>Staff Report</u>. Staff recommends approval of a reaffirmation of a modification of Sect. 13-305 of the <u>Zoning Ordinance</u> in favor of that shown on the Generalized Development Plan (GDP).

## Fairfax County Launches Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy and Resiliency Program

Fairfax County officials announced on February 13, 2020 the launch of a Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy and Resiliency (C-PACE) program, a financing tool designed to encourage building owners to pursue energy-saving, water-saving, and resiliency projects within commercial properties. Through the program, building owners looking to complete specific capital improvement projects can secure private funding which is then repaid via a property tax assessment.

C-PACE allows building owners to make substantial improvements to older buildings, or to add sustainable technologies to new buildings, with little or no up-front cost. The loans are typically long-term, sometimes tied to the useful life of the eligible improvement and carry with the property from one owner to the next. This lending model allows building owners to undertake large-scale projects and improvements with minimal initial capital outlays, preserving cash flow, and producing near-term operational savings.

Commercial building owners interested in <u>learning more about the Fairfax County C-PACE</u> <u>program</u> can attend a series of workshops this spring. Application materials are available on the <u>VPA website</u>.
