Goal 1: Community outreach efforts to stakeholders, FCPS student leaders, and special interest groups around the 911 system

Goal 1 Progress:

- 1a. Educate and build trust with community members on 9-1-1 services
 - We continue to build trust with community members and looking to increase the number of events we attend. For 2022 the following occurred
 - 15 community events attended
 - Unable to see an increase/decrease in the community of areas reached due to COVID. 2022 will be used as a baseline for comparison due to not being able to attend functions.
 - Reference measurable of seeing how many community members participates at each event, is unmeasurable and will be removed from the plan.
- 1b. Establish a greater presence within Fairfax County's underserved community
 - DPSC attended 9 events in areas with "High Vulnerability"
 - This will continue to be on our plan, as things are getting back to normal, we are able to attend more events.

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- 1c. Establishing additional and maintain on-going educational programs with Fairfax County Public Schools
 - WPHS 911 ETC Classes-
 - SY 2021-2022 Due to student behavioral issues- Virtual classes were not effective and are to resume in the following school year
 - SY 2022-2023 Due to not having a teacher for this class, the class was cancelled for FCPS students
 - WPHS EMT Classes-
 - SY 2021-2022 Due to staffing, unable to provide virtual classes
 - SY 2022-2023 Due to not having a teach for this class, the class was cancelled for FCPS students
 - WPHS Criminal Justice Classes-
 - SY 2021-2022 Presented to 5 classes (100 students)
 - SY 2022-2023 Presented to 5 classes (100 students)
 - SY 2022-2023 Field Trip to PSTOC for Criminal Justice Level 2 (25 students)
 - o Falls Church HS EMT Classes-
 - SY 2022-2023 Presented to 3 classes (50 students)
 - Falls Church HS Criminal Justice Classes-
 - SY 2022-2023 Presented to 2 classes (50 students)
- 1d. Establish social media platform and market for community members to access our digital media platforms
 - Hired Outreach Coordinator who started in late September early October with DPSC.
 She has reached out to OPA and completed and submitted social media Facebook agency request form on Monday November 14, 2022. Currently we are awaiting a response from OPA.
- 1e. Establishment of community outreach platform to log compliments/concerns
 - Compliment/ concern portal is complete and active for external customer use. Platform went live February 2022.

Goal 2: Recruitment in Fairfax County's diverse and historically underserved communities

Goal 2 Progress:

- 2a. Educate community members on 9-1-1 services and career opportunities
 - 12 Career events attended
 - 5 events outside of Fairfax County
 - 2 Future events are listed for 2023
 - DPSC applications for new positions carried an overall rate of 65% of diversity in the applicant pool
- 2b. Reaching the historically underserved communities for potential employment opportunities

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- 5 Career events hosted in areas with "High Vulenrability"
- o 3 Language stipend test were successfully completed

- 2c. Hiring of Outreach Coordinator

 We hired our Outreach coordinator in September 2022. She brings great ideas to the agency.

- 2d. Diversity on hiring panel

8 hiring panels were conducted this year. DPSC was able to almost reach the goal of 50%
 Diversity, we close the year out with 44.62% diversity on our panels.

Goal 3: Reclassification of 9-1-1 Call-Takers and Dispatchers as First Responders

Goal 3 Progress:

- 3a. Reclassify 9-1-1 Dispatchers as Public Safety Personnel (first responders)
 - DPSC has garnered the support of the Deputy County Executive for Public Safety and is in the process of garnering the support of other County Leadership and elected officials.
 - DPSC is working with other regional 9-1-1 centers to identify the best ways to further and support this reclassification and to identify impacts to stakeholders.

Goal 4: Community Behavioral Health Initiatives

Goal 4 Progress:

- 4a. Educate Fairfax community on Marcus Alert triage framework, it's voluntary database and regional call center-988
 - The Fairfax County local plan for the Behavioral Health Crisis Response System (BHCRS)/ Marcus Alert (MA) is schedule to go live locally on July 1, 2023.
 - The voluntary database remains active for public registration.
 - 988 platform went live July 2022. Regional Crisis call centers will launch with BHCRS/ MA on July 1, 2023.

Goal 5 Progress:

- 5a. Educate DPSC leaders with One Fairfax initiatives and training
 - This will be carried out in 2023
