D U S C R I P T I O N	County Code § 82-5B Prohibits parking watercraft, motor homes, campers, trailers, vehicles ≥ 3 axles, vehicles ≥ 12,000 lbs., and vehicles transporting ≥ 16 passengers (except school buses). OUALIFICATIONS: → Residential public road AND → 2000 linear feet or 5 block face minimum for petition, whichever is less (New Districts only) <u>OR</u> Supervisor requested large area application	County Code § 82-5A         Prohibits parking along designated streets within a District without a District Permit.         QUALIFICATIONS:         1) Distance:         Residential public road within 2,000 ft. walking distance from pedestrian entrance or 1,000 ft. from the property boundary of a High School, existing or proposed Rail Station, or existing Virginia College or University         OR         2) Parking Demand Study:         * Minimum of 100 contiguous parking spaces required (New District only)         → ≥ 75% of spaces occupied AND         → ≥ 50% of those vehicles are non-residents	<ul> <li>County Code § 82-5-7 Parking the following vehicles in residential districts is prohibited: <ul> <li>Vehicles that exceed size and weight limits of: <ul> <li>More than 21 feet long, more than 8 feet high, including appurtenances, width of 102 in. or more, or gross vehicle weight of 12,000 or more pounds.</li> <li>Examples of vehicles exempt from these height and weight limits are commercial vehicles used by public service company, watercraft or motor home (unless in a CPD), school buses, personal vehicles used for transporting persons with disabilities and contracted moving vehicles for 48 hours. (Link to additional exceptions below)</li> </ul> </li> <li>Any vehicle licensed as a common or contract carrier or limousine One resident of each single family dwelling unit may park one vehicle licensed and registered in the Commonwealth of Virginia as a taxicab or limousine (see additional information below)</li> <li>Vehicles carrying commercial freight in plain view,</li> <li>Trailer or semitrailer except camper, boat or *single axle utility</li> <li>Any Vehicle with 3 or more axles</li> <li>* "Utility trailer" means: A small non-motorized trailer which is generally pulled by a motorized vehicle and features an open-top cargo area.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
P R O C E D U R E S	By petition: 1. HOA submits request to District Supervisor* 2. District Supervisor forwards request to FCDOT 3. FCDOT issues petition and area map, if eligible 4. Signatures gathered verifying ≥60% support from entire area <u>and</u> >50% on each block 5. Completed petition returned to Supervisor with fee of \$10 per petitioning address signature 6. Supervisor forwards petition and fees to FCDOT for review 7.
