How Capital Bikeshare works

- Bicycle transit service allows people to rent a bike and ride to one of 762 stations in 8 jurisdictions
- Serves as first and last mile from Metro
- Ridership fees
 - Members pay \$95 per year for unlimited 45-minute rides
 - Non-members pay \$1 to unlock a bike and \$0.05 per minute
 - Capital Bikeshare for All for low-income residents gives unlimited 60minute riders including e-bikes
- Bicycles designed with safety in mind
 - Upright and slow, always-on lights, bright red
 - Few reported crashes in Fairfax County

Rationale for station locations

- Build on existing network in Alexandria and planned expansion in Franconia District
- Provide first and last mile trips to and from Metro
- Serve namesake attraction and bike trail
- Meet technical requirements such as solar access and safety
- Meet programmatic requirements such as underserved neighborhoods, residential density and attract ridership and revenue



Mount Vernon District Map


Mount Vernon Estate, Fort Hunt Park and Riverside Park are not shown

Black line is approximate boundary between Franconia and Mount Vernon Districts


















Electric bikes (e-bikes)

- Fairfax County hosted contractor-provided e-bikes since July 2020
- Plan to acquire e-bikes with Countywide TAP grant
- E-bikes generated 14% of trips despite averaging 8% of bike fleet from July 2020-August 2023
- Can lock to public bike rack instead a docking station (i.e. dockless) with a ¼ mile of a station (service area)
 - 6% of trips started or ended outside of dock Countywide
 - Equity members ride for free for 60 minutes and \$2 out of station fee waived
- Buying our own ensures future e-bike service as black colored contractor-provided e-bikes will gradually phase out
- E-bike capital cost \$3,900 versus \$1,100 for classic bikes
 - Funded by federal grant and users pay e-bike operations cost

Next steps

- Work with VDOT through the federal grant process and obtain permits
- Station installation late this year or 2025 for stations near Huntington Metro
- Station installation in 2025 or later for remaining locations
