# Reston Roadway Projects w/ 2025 Estimates

- Soapstone Drive Extension (Dulles Toll Road (DTR) Overpass) \$235M
- Town Center Parkway Extension (DTR Underpass) \$420M
- Reston Parkway Widening (South Lakes Drive to DTR) \$46.2M
- Fairfax County Parkway HOV (DTR to West Ox Widening) \$148M
- Fairfax County Parkway/Sunrise Valley Drive Interchange \$740M
- South Lakes Drive Extension (DTR Overpass) \$166M
- Fox Mill Road Widening (Reston Parkway to Monroe Street) \$111M
- West Ox Road Widening (Lawyers Road to Centreville Road) \$185M
- Monroe Street Widening (West Ox Road to Town of Herndon) \$148M
- Pinecrest Road Extension (South Lakes Drive to Sunrise Valley Drive) \$46.2M



# **Soapstone Drive Extension**

- Extension of Soapstone Drive from Sunrise
  Valley Drive over the DTR to Sunset Hills
  Road. Includes multimodal facilities.
- ~\$235M current estimate, fully funded.
  - VDOT agreement Spring 2025.
- VDOT Public Info Meeting Oct 2024.
- VDOT issued the Notice to Proceed to its consultant in February 2024 to initiate design.
- Tentative Schedule:
  - Current: design
  - 2027 2028: land acquisition
  - 2032 construction start

# Intersection Improvements w/ 2025 Estimates

- Fairfax County Parkway/Sunrise Valley Drive (Interim) \$2M
- Reston Parkway/ Baron Cameron Avenue \$4.3M
- Wiehle Avenue/ DTR eastbound (EB) on/off ramps \$1.1M
- Reston Parkway/ Sunrise Valley Drive \$27.7M
- Reston Parkway/ DTR westbound (WB) on/off ramps \$9.2M
- Reston Parkway/ Bluemont Way \$7.4M
- Reston Parkway/ New Dominion Parkway \$9.2M
- Centreville Road/Sunrise Valley Drive \$18.5M
- Centreville Road/ DTR EB on/off ramps \$2.7M
- Hunter Mill Road/ Sunset Hills Road \$6.4M
- Sunset Hills Road Realignment TBD



# **Intersection Improvements**

# Fairfax County Parkway/Sunrise Valley Drive (Interim)

- Intersection improvements including modifying lane configs for WB movement NB right turn lane.
- Implemented with the Sunrise Valley Dr Cycle Track (SVDCT) project.
- SVDCT has completed 30% design.
- ~\$32.2M estimate for SVDCT.

### Reston Parkway/ Baron Cameron Avenue

- Construct 2<sup>nd</sup> turn lane from WB Baron
  Cameron Avenue to SB Reston Parkway.
- Study found finding no significant improvement to intersection ops.
- Alternatives considered, and study concluded Fall 2023.
- Project is at 15% design.
- ~\$4.3M revised estimate.


### **Grid of Streets**

- Improvements to transform current superblock street network to a more urban model.
- Allows for more options when going from point A to point B, reducing the demand on streets.
- Partially funded by Service District:
  - ~\$119M (2025 dollars, \$94M in 2017).

- \$550K for North Shore Drive/Temporary Road improvements.
  - New traffic signal, ped signals,
    ADA ramps, and pavement markings.
- ~\$8.4M for land acquisition on New Dominion Drive for future grid improvements.

# **Cashflow Highlights**

- \$4.2B revised 2025 estimate for RFP.
  About 85% increase over 2017/2018 estimate of \$2.3B.
- Cost increases based on National Highway Construction Cost Index (NHCCI).
- Revenue growth assumed at 3% annually for same period.
- As projected expenditure growth exceeds growth in revenue, the dela is funded with TBD revenues.

- Reston Parkway/DTR WB on/off ramps FF
- Reston Parkway/Bluemont Way PF




### **Road Fund Rate**

- Adjusted annually for inflation using CPI-U.
- Current rate was increased 3.1% over 2023 rate.
- Approved by BOS April 2024, and effective since May 1, 2024.
- Next rate change scheduled for April 22,
  2025. Requesting 3% increase.


# **Assessed Value History**



 Stagnant growth during periods of excessive inflation (past few years) means project implementation gets pushed out.



### **Collections To Date**



- \$18.1M in service district collections to date (includes interest)
  - \$165K spent to date.
- \$24.1M in road fund collections to date
  - ~\$9M spent to date.

### **Rate Recommendation**

- The Board will hold public hearings on the FY2025 budget and tax rates on April 22-24, 2025
  - Will vote on Budget on May 13, 20245
  - On March 18, 2025, Board voted to advertise a \$0.021 rate for the Reston Service District
- Staff recommends holding rate flat at \$0.021. Vote needed.

February 18: County Executive releases FY 2026 Advertised Budget Plan

February 20: School Board adopts FY 2026 (proposed) Budget Plan

February 25: Joint County/School Budget Committee to discuss FY 2026 budget and tax rate

March 18: Board of Supervisors Advertises FY 2026 tax rate

March 18: Board of Supervisors Advertises FY 2025 Third Quarter Review

April 22: School Board Presents FCPS Budget to Board of Supervisors

April 22-24: Board of Supervisors holds public hearings on FY 2026 Budget

May 6: Board of Supervisors marks-up FY 2026 Budget

May 13: Board of Supervisors adopts FY 2026 Budget

May 22: School Board adopts FY 2026 Approved Budget

July 1: FY 2026 Budget Year begins
