

- Fairfax Center Area Comprehensive Plan Amendment



Volume/Capacity ratio, Delay, Queue lengths, Bicycle Level of Traffic Stress, Pedestrian Level of Comfort





Survey Overview


- Comments and survey responses were taken from February 12 through March 1, 2024
 - There were 370 participants
 - **1,293** views
 - 2,459 individual responses
 - 448 comments






























What would encourage you to walk or bike along Route 29?



Top Encouragement

- Safer facilities
 - ☐ Dedicated and wider sidewalk/bike lane
 - Separation from roadway
- · Continuous facilities
- "Greater separation from traffic and easier access from my residence."
- "Dedicated bike path with access from Fairfax city neighborhoods."
- "Continuous sidewalks on both sides of Route 29."








Top Pedestrian/Bicycle Concerns

- Continuous sidewalks and shared use paths
- Wider sidewalks and paths
- Better separation between sidewalk and roadway

Top Intersection Traffic Concerns

- Long delays when making left turn
- Short turning lanes at Shirley Gate/Waples Mill Rd intersection.
- Walmart intersection with severe vehicle-pedestrian conflict

Pedestrian Network


Qualitative metric of pedestrians' perceived comfort when travelling along or crossing a roadway

- PLOC 1 is most comfortable
- PLOC 4 is least comfortable

Pathway factors include

- Pathway and buffer widths
- Posted speed limit
- Presence of parking lane, bike lane, street trees

Pedestrian Level of Comfort



Crossing factors include

- Number of lanes
- Posted speed limit
- Presence of median, pedestrian refuge
- Type of crosswalk markings



Buffered bike lane on a low-speed street



LTS 3

comfortable for confident bicyclists

Narrow bike lane or shoulder on a busy street





LTS 4

uncomfortable for most

No bike lane on a busy street







Pedestrian Planning Context

- Fairfax County Comprehensive Plan
 - Streetscapes and landscaped buffers near Waples Mill Road
 - Landscaped buffering between
 Government Center and West Ox Road
 - Removal of the asphalt service drive

- Active Transportation Improvements
 - Slip lane refuge median islands
 - Pedestrian countdown signals
 - Lead Pedestrian Interval at heavy pedestrian areas
 - High visibility crosswalks
 - Pedestrian Hybrid Beacons at key midblock crossing locations
 - Advance warning signs


