PROJECT BACKGROUND

Fairfax County Department of Transportation (FCDOT) is planning for a Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) system along Richmond Highway and North Kings Highway from Huntington Metrorail Station to Fort Belvoir.

BRT is a high-quality public transportation system designed to be fast, reliable, and more convenient than traditional bus routes.

THIRD PUBLIC MEETING

FCDOT held the third public meeting for the project on September 17, 2019, in the gymnasium at Bryant High School. There were approx. 250 community members in attendance.

Meeting topics included:

- » Envrionmental/Historic Resources
- » BRT System & Roadway Design
- » BRT Station Themes
- » BRT Ridership
- » Traffic Analyses

The community was asked to provide their input on a survey. All meeting materials, including the survey, were

posted on the project website after the meeting. While the comment period of these materials has closed, the presentation and display boards remain available on the proejct website, along with a summary of community input.

PROGRESS UPDATE

Following the third community meeting, Fairfax County's project team has been:

- » evolving the system and station design,
- » finalizing the environmental evaluation,
- » developing options for branding the BRT system,
- » and providing project updates at meetings and other events.




