


The Transportation Planning Board's (TPB) Long-Range Plan: Visualize 2050 and the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP)

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Background

- Federally designated metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the region.
- Mandated planning process: fiscally constrained regional long-range plan (LRTP) and the Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP)
- Transportation revenues over the next 25 years
- Regionally significant projects, regardless of the funding source.
 - Example Express lanes are included; sidewalks are not, unless they are federally funded



Background (continued)

- Air Quality Conformity Determination.
- Nitrogen Oxide (NOx) and Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC), but not carbon dioxide (CO2)
- In August 2022, federal partners approved the conformity determination for the Visualize 2045 update and the FY 2023-FY 2026 TIP
- TPB must obtain the same federal approval for the conformity determination no later than August 2026

Visualize 2050

- In June 2021, TPB initiated a full update to the LRTP after adoption of Visualize 2045. Target completion: end of 2024.
- The new plan, Visualize 2050 will include:
 - 'zero-based budgeting'
- Prior to 2021, projects historically included in the LRTP were carried forward

Get Ready for Visualize 2050!

Visualize 2050 (continued) – changes associated with this update.

- Extend outyear of Plan from 2045 to 2050
- New financial plan
 - Updated transportation funding estimates I)
 - Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act
- New Motor Vehicle Emissions Budgets (MVEBs)
 - New emissions model (MOVES3)
 - New MVEBs for 2015 Ozone Standards
 - Re-estimate vehicle mix
- Zero-Based Budget Process



Visualize 2050: Zero-Based Budget Process

- The new plan:
 - Multiple build scenarios
 - Synthesized Policy Framework: summary of past scenario studies.
 - Exempt: Projects: Under construction or funded
 - Non-Exempt: Projects in development
 - Fairfax County's inputs
 - 25 projects exempt (see attached list)
 - 33 projects non-exempt (see attached list)



Visualize 2050: Climate Change Mitigation

The new plan will also consider:

- The adoption of regional, voluntary, on-road transportation-sector GHG reduction goals
 - 50% below 2005 levels by 2030
 - Matches Fairfax County Community-wide Energy and Climate Action Plan (CECAP)
 - 80% below 2005 levels by 2050
 - CECAP goal: 75% reduction by 2040
- Seven GHG strategies that have the potential to reduce on-road transportation GHG
- Seven other GHG strategies which merit further coordinated discussion



Visualize 2050 Timeline

- January 2023:
 - Technical Input Solicitation Document (TIS) presented for review
 - LRTP and TIS webpage established
 - Comments due on TIS
- February 15, 2023:
 - TPB releases Call for Projects
 - List of Exempt and Non-Exempt Projects published for review
- March June 2023
 - Comments received on exempt and non-exempt projects
 - TPB staff will meet with Board members and staff
 - County staff will seek Board endorsement of exempt & non-exempt projects
 - High level analysis of revenues and expenditures



Visualize 2050 Timeline

- July August 2023
 - Preliminary project inputs for LRTP and Air Quality Conformity (AQC)
 - Reconcile draft financial analysis results and produce preliminary financial plan reflecting project submissions
- September 2023
 - Public comment on plan and AQC analysis, and AQC scope of work
 - TPB briefing on draft inputs for AQC



Visualize 2050 Timeline

- October 2023
 - Review of public comment for AQC
- November 2023
 - Draft inputs to the plan and AQC
 - Financial Analysis
- December 2023
 - TPB staff commence AQC Analysis:
 - nine months to a year.
- December 2024
 - TPB approves Visualize 2050 and the FY 2025-2028 TIP
