TRIP Background

- State grant program supporting zero and reduced fare programs to increase transit ridership
- CTB awarded Fairfax County ~ \$5.49 million
 for a three-year half-fare pilot program
 - FY 2022: \$2.2 million
 - FY 2023: \$1.9 million
 - FY 2024: \$1.3 million
- Program anticipated to help low-income residents recovering from the pandemic and help restore Fairfax Connector ridership





- Program Eligibility Criteria
 - Resident of Fairfax County, City of Fairfax or City of Falls Church, and
 - Annual income at or below 225% of the federal poverty level by household size
- Potential Program Implementation Partners
 - Department of Transportation (FCDOT)
 - Department of Family Services (DFS)
 - Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD)
 - Department of Neighborhood and Community Services (NCS)
 - Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA)

Next Steps

- Finalize program administration framework and processes
 - Potentially similar to Free Student Bus Pass Program
- Negotiate an MOU with WMATA for customized SmarTrip cards
- Prepare outreach and marketing materials



Next Steps (Continued)

- Proposed program launch
 - Begin pilot by promoting subsidy to DFS and HCD clients
 - Marketing and distribution of customized SmarTrip cards anticipated to begin Summer 2022
- Track and evaluate program participation
- Consider further program expansion based on results of pilot
