Funding

Board Transportation Committee

- Board approved \$100 million over six years to fund active transportation projects.
- Board was provided with an extensive list of unfunded active transportation projects for which the \$100 million could be used. <u>Prioritization methodology</u> being developed.
- Identification of immediate needs to be addressed with an initial \$5 million while methodology is finalized and may include:
 - Priority crosswalk improvements
 - Priority maintenance needs
 - Initiating priority linear projects

Transportation Priority Plan (TPP)

On Dec. 3, 2019, the Board of Supervisors approved the FY 2020–2025 TPP that directs County priorities for transportation projects through FY 2025.

Current funding estimate for transportation capital projects to be implemented in Fairfax County through FY 2025 is \$3.036 billion.




Local funds used for active transportation projects:

- General Fund






City of Falls Church: Bicycle Master Plan



Pedestrian Level of Comfort

Pedestrian level of comfort


Scores applied to street segments within one-mile radius of the Metrorail Station.

Scores are based on the following variables:

• Pathway width

- Street trees
- Posted speed limit
- Buffer width
- Striped parking lane
- Average Daily Traffic
- Bike lane
- Curb or curbless

Level of Comfort
1 = Very Comfortable
2 = Comfortable
3 = Satisfactory
4 = Uncomfortable
5 = No Pathway





Crosswalk from Barbour Rd to Cartbridge Rd

Fill in sidewalk gaps along Idylwood Rd

Construct sidewalks along Barbour Rd/ widen sidewalk across bridge

Construct sidewalks along Pinecastle Rd

Connect Wieland Place and Buckelew Dr

Construct sidewalk along Allan Ave (*active cut-through RTAP)



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
Provide high-visibility crosswalks at all ramp crossings along Leesburg Pike

Adjust signal timing to provide safer crossing for pedestrians

Fill sidewalk gaps along Gordons Rd and Chestnut St

Construct sidewalk along north side of Shreve Rd from Chestnut St to Gordons Rd

Improve visibility at corner of W&OD Trail, Pinecastle Rd, and Shreve Rd



Add sidewalk along Redd Rd to Idylwood Rd

Provide high-visibility crosswalks at the intersection of Pimmit Dr and Leesburg Pike. Add crosswalks to NE and SE legs.

Provide high-visibility crosswalks at the intersection of Idylwood Rd and Leesburg Pike



Level of Comfort 1 = Very Comfortable 2 = Comfortable 3 = Satisfactory 4 = Uncomfortable 5 = No Pathway

Complete sidewalk from Norwalk St to bridge on southside of Idylwood Rd (Note: sidewalk does not continue past bridge)

Improve visibility of mid-block crossing with flashing beacons


Clear vegetation on corner of Redd Rd and Idylwood Rd to improve visibility

Create accessible pedestrian route to Metro from Idylwood Rd

Add mid-block crossing over Great Falls St for access to Pimmit Run Stream Valley Park

Fill sidewalk gap on Great Falls St

Add crosswalk over Great Falls St at Hutchison St for Haycock/ Longwood students



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Add mid-block crosswalk over Westmoreland St at Orland St

Add corner expansion/ bulb outs and no RTOR for SB Westmoreland St at Haycock Rd

Add mid-block crossing from Casemont Dr to N side of Haycock Rd

Construct sidewalk on one side of Beacon Ln

Construct sidewalk along Turner Ave from Grayson PI to Haycock Rd

Widen pathway and decrease slope along north side of Haycock Rd approaching bridge over I-66

Road-diet on Haycock Rd from north of bridge to Metro Access Rd

Construct sidewalk along south side of Haycock Rd from Westwood PI to bridge over I-66

Trail maintenance on Grove Ave approaching Haycock Rd

Construct sidewalk on Mt Daniel Dr



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Add stop bars to existing AWS Fisher Ave/ BriyIn PI intersection


Construct sidewalk on Fisher Ave

COUNTYWIDE TRAILS PLAN


As Adopted by the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors October 28, 2014 Amended through July 1, 2018

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
- Maintenance agreement for "gateways" into the transit station area
