

3 Year Fiscal Year Comparison




FY 2014 Archery Locations

The total number of deer culled in FY 2014 was 1,005. 84.4% of those culled were through the Archery Program.


27 archery groups (nearly 700 citizens) participated in the Archery Program from mid-September to mid-February.

The Archery Program, utilizes volunteers rather than paid employees, making it the most cost effective of the three program types.


FY 2013:

There were 10 Sharpshooting Operations with an average of 10.7 deer culled per operation






FY 2014 White Buffalo, Inc. Sharpshooting Totals by Location

#### FY 2014:


There were 2 Managed Hunt Operations with an average of 25 deer culled per operation

A collective year-end review of the Deer Management Program is conducted at the conclusion of the Fiscal Year with our partners at the Fairfax County Park Authority, Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority, Fairfax County Department of Public Works and Environmental Services (Urban Forest Management Division), and the Fairfax County Health Department.

In the absence of a county wildlife biologist, we have coordinated with the regional biologist from the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (DGIF) to solicit input regarding our programs. We are also coordinating with experts on deer management in order to enhance the safety and efficiency of our sharpshooter program.



In an ongoing effort to establish clear goals which also allow an assessment of the effectiveness of our programs, we are working with our partners to establish a set of clear and measurable goals designed to measure both the effectiveness of the deer management program and its long term sustainability.
